10) Himachal Pradesh to Build North India's First Green Hydrogen Plant

On February 5, 2025, Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu laid the foundation stone for North India's first 1-megawatt (MW) green hydrogen plant in Dabhota, Nalagath Tehsil, Solan district.

- Collaboration: The project is a joint effort between the Himachal Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (HPPCL) and Oil India Limited (OIL), with an estimated investment of ₹9.04 crore.
- Objective: Aligns with HP's goal to become India's first Green Energy State by March 2026.
- Project Specifications:
- o **Location: 4,000 square meters** in Dabhota.
- Technology: Utilizes renewable energy (RE) sources to produce hydrogen through electrolysis, using an alkaline potassium hydroxide solution as the electrolyte.
- o Production Capacity:

 kg of green hydrogen.
- o Resource Requirements:

11) Kerala Secures Rs 2,424 cr World Bank Loan to Strengthen Healthcare System

The **Kerala Health System Improvement** (**KHSIP**) is a landmark Programme initiative by the **Kerala government** to strengthen healthcare infrastructure and improve public health outcomes. Approved on **February 7, 2025**, by the state Cabinet chaired by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, the project will be implemented with financial assistance of ₹2,424.28 **crore** from the World Bank under the Programme for Results (P for **R**) model. Below is a detailed breakdown of the programme's objectives, key focus areas, and expected outcomes:

Overview of KHSIP

- **Objective**: To enhance healthcare resilience, prevent diseases, and improve the overall quality of life for Kerala's citizens.
- Funding: ₹2,424.28 crore from the World Bank under the Programme for Results (P for R) model, which links disbursement of funds to the achievement of specific results.

12) NABARD Sanctions Projects for Himachal Pradesh

13) Haryana Launches 'Har Khet-Swasth Khet' to Boost Soil Health

The Haryana government has launched the 'Har Khet-Swasth Khet' campaign to improve soil health and promote sustainable farming practices. The initiative involves statewide soil testing and issuing Soil Health Cards to help farmers make informed decisions on soil fertility and nutrient management.

Soil Sample Collection and Soil Health Cards

- Statewide soil testing for every acre of farmland in Haryana.
- **70 lakh soil samples** have been collected so far.
- 55 lakh samples have been analyzed, and soil health cards have been distributed.
- More than 86 lakh Soil Health Cards issued to farmers.
- Work on the **remaining samples** is ongoing.

Infrastructure for Soil and Water Testing

- **17 new permanent** soil and water testing **laboratories** set up across Harvana.
- 54 small soil testing labs established in mandis (marketplaces).
- 240 small labs set up in senior secondary schools and colleges, where students conduct soil testing as part of their education.

14) Odisha's Antyodaya Gruha Yojana: A Housing Initiative for Vulnerable Families

The Odisha Cabinet, headed by Chief Minister (CM) Mohan Charan Majhi, has approved the launch of the Antyodaya Gruha Yojana, a housing scheme aimed at providing pucca houses to eligible vulnerable families. An outlay of Rs. 7,550 crores have been allocated for the implementation of the scheme.

- Each beneficiary under this scheme will receive financial assistance of Rs 1.2 lakhs to build a 25-squaremeter (sq m) pucca house (excluding the toilet area).
- Under the scheme, the Odisha government aims to build at least

2,25,000 houses over the next 3 years.

Objective:

Antyodaya Gruha Yojana aims to improve the standard of living for weaker sections of society in Odisha by providing them with permanent housing.

Note: This initiative complements the existing schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana- Gramin (PMAY-G) and the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM-JANMAN), reinforcing Odisha's commitment to affordable housing for all.

16) India with 89 Sites has the largest number of Ramsar sites in Asia

India has recently added four new wetlands to the Ramsar Wetland Sites list, bringing the total number of Ramsar sites in the country to 89. This makes India the third-largest country in the world in terms of Ramsar sites, after the United Kingdom (175) and Mexico (142). India leads Asia in the number of Ramsar sites, ahead of China (82 sites). Tamil Nadu has the highest number of Ramsar sites in India, with 20 sites.

The four new sites are:

- 1. Sakkarakottai Bird Sanctuary (Tamil Nadu): A man-made tank from 1321 A.D., home to 116 bird species, including some near-threatened species.
- 2. **Therthangal Bird Sanctuary** (**Tamil Nadu**): Another man-made tank, home to 48 bird species, also important for migratory birds.
- 3. **Khecheopalri Wetland (Sikkim)**: A high-altitude lake surrounded by forest, hosting Trans-Himalayan migratory birds.
- 4. Udhwa Lake (Jharkhand): A large lake connected to the Ganga River, home to 83 bird species, including endangered and near-threatened species.

17) India Gate Lighted to Mark World Neglected Tropical Diseases Day 2025

The iconic **India Gate** was illuminated on **30th January 2025** in vibrant hues of purple and orange colours on the occasion of **World Neglected Tropical Diseases Day**. The World Neglected Tropical Diseases Day is observed every year since

2022 on **30th January** to raise awareness about neglected tropical diseases.

On this occasion across the world, iconic landmarks are lit up to emphasize the importance of the world's collective action to combat these debilitating diseases.

Who organised the event in India?

- The lighting of the India Gate event on the occasion of the World Neglected Tropical Disease was organised by the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
- The special focus during the event was on Lymphatic Filariasis and Visceral Leishmaniasis or Kala-Azar, diseases that threaten around 40 crore people in India.
- The illumination of India Gate was accompanied by a street play focussed on these diseases and on the importance of eradicating these diseases through behavioral changes and mass participation in the Ministry's initiatives like Mass Drug Administration rounds for Lymphatic Filariasis.

18) Centre Allocates Rs 3,027 Cr for Disaster Mitigation

A High-Level Committee (HLC), chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, has approved a substantial allocation of Rs 3.027.86 crore for various disaster mitigation projects across different states in India. The committee, which includes key members such as Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, and the Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog, reviewed and approved a range of projects aimed at addressing lightning safety, drought-prone regions, management. These and forest fire projects are intended to strengthen

India's disaster preparedness and reduce the impact of natural disasters.

Total Financial Approval: Rs 3,027.86 crore approved for various disaster mitigation projects across multiple states.

19) Rise in Female Labour Force Participation Says Economic Survey

The Economic Survey for 2024-25 significant highlighted a rise in the Female Labour Force Participation Rate (FLFPR) in India, driven largely by women in rural areas joining the workforce. This increase is considered a key factor contributing to the improvement of overall labour market indicators in the country. The findings were presented by **Finance** Minister Union Nirmala Sitharaman on January 31, 2025, during the tabling of the survey in Parliament. The surge in FLFPR has been attributed government schemes, women's entrepreneurship initiatives, and better inclusion of women in economic activities.

Key Takeaways from the Economic Survey 2024-25:

- 1. Increase in Female Labour Force Participation Rate (FLFPR):
 - FLFPR rose from 23.3% in 2017-18 to 41.7% in 2023-24.
 - 21 states have FLFPR between 30% and 40%; 7 states/UTs report FLFPR

above 40%, with Sikkim leading at 56.9%.

2. Rural Women's Participation:

- Rural FLFPR increased from 24.6% in 2017-18 to 47.6% in 2023-24.
- Government schemes like
 Deendayal Antyodaya
 Yojana (DAY-NRLM)
 helped increase rural
 women's workforce
 participation.

3. Government Initiatives:

- Skilling programs and better access to credit for rural women contributed to economic participation.
- Women's entrepreneurship focus led to 73,151 start-ups with at least one woman director by October 2024.

4. Challenges for Rural Women Entrepreneurs:

- Barriers include limited business skills, market access, technology gaps, and lack of mentorship.
- Continued government support for credit, formalization of businesses, and service delivery is essential.

5. Periodic Labour Force Survey:

 Survey conducted in districts of Bihar, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, and Uttar Pradesh (November 2024) to capture more women in unpaid work.

20) Gender Budgeting in 2025-26: A Step Toward Inclusive Growth

The Union Budget 2025-26, presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on February 1, 2025, has

made significant strides in gender budgeting, increasing the share of the Gender Budget allocation to 8.86% of the total Union Budget, compared to 6.8% in FY 2024-25. The allocation for women and girls has risen to ₹4.49 lakh crore, marking a 37.25% increase from the previous vear's ₹3.27 lakh crore. Additionally, 49 Ministries/Departments and 5 UTs have reported gender-specific allocations. making it the highest number of contributors to the Gender Budget Statement (GBS) since its inception.

Key Highlights of the Gender Budget 2025-26:

1. Total Gender Budget Allocation:

• ₹4.49 lakh crore allocated for women and girls, a 37.25% increase from ₹3.27 lakh crore in FY 2024-25.

2. Share in Union Budget:

• The share of the Gender Budget has increased to 8.86% of the total Union Budget, up from 6.8% in FY 2024-25.

3. Number of Reporting Ministries/Departments:

 49 Ministries/Departments have reported genderspecific allocations, an increase from 38 in FY 2024-25.

4. Number of Reporting UTs:

• 5 Union Territories (UTs) have contributed to the Gender Budget Statement (GBS) for the first time.

5. New Ministries/Departments Reporting for the First Time:

 New contributors include the Departments of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Biotechnology, Fisheries, Financial Services, Pharmaceuticals, Food & Public Distribution, Land Resources, and Water Resources, well as as Ministries of Food Processing Industries, Panchayati Raj, Ports. Shipping & Waterways, and Railways.

6. Breakdown of Gender Budget Allocations:

- Part A (100% womenspecific schemes): ₹1,05,535.40 crore (23.50% of total GBS).
- Part B (30-99% allocation for women): ₹3,26,672.00 crore (72.75% of total GBS).

7. Trends in Gender Budget Statement (GBS):

- Since its introduction in FY 2005-06, the Gender Budget has grown consistently.
- The GBS as a percentage of total expenditure was 5% in FY 2019-20 and has now reached 9% in FY 2025-26.

21) PM-JANMAN Package for Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups

The PM-JANMAN Package (Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan) was launched in November 2023 with the primary objective of improving the conditions of Particularly living Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) in **India.** This initiative comes as a solution to the longstanding challenges faced by these marginalized communities. The mission is designed bring significant to infrastructural socio-economic and

improvements through a series of strategic interventions.

Objective: Launched in November 2023, the **PM-JANMAN Package** aims to uplift Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) by addressing their long-standing socio-economic challenges and improving living conditions. The initiative focuses on comprehensive infrastructural and welfare interventions for these marginalized communities.

22) India's First White Tiger Breeding Centre Approved in MP

The Central Zoo Authority (CZA) has approved India's first white breeding centre in Madhya Pradesh's Rewa district. This initiative marks a significant step in wildlife conservation, especially since Rewa is historically linked to the last known wild white tiger. The project, initially approved in principle in 2011, will be established in Govindgarh, near the state's only white tiger safari in Mukundpur. The breeding centre is to enhance expected biodiversity conservation, promote wildlife tourism, and create job opportunities for the local population.

23) MeitY and IIT Indore Launch AgriHub for Agritech Excellence

The Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY) and IIT Indore have launched AgriHub, a state-of-the-art AI-driven Center of Excellence (CoE) aimed at transforming

Indian agriculture. AgriHub seeks to address critical challenges in agriculture, such as drought, floods, and low productivity, through the integration of AI, Machine Learning (ML), and Deep Learning (DL). It also aims to address issues such as illegal wildlife trade, poaching, and climate change. The IBCA was officially launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on April 9, 2023, during the 50th anniversary of India's 'Project Tiger'. As of January 23, 2025, the alliance gained full international legal status, with ratifications from five countries—India, Nicaragua, Eswatini, Somalia, and Liberia. Several national and international organizations involved wildlife conservation have also partnered with the IBCA.

40) India Sets New HS Codes for GI- Tagged Rice Exports

India, as one of the world's largest rice exporters, is taking significant steps to streamline the export process of GItagged rice varieties by introducing new Harmonized System of Nomenclature (HSN) codes. This move is expected to provide better recognition to specialty rice types such as Red Rice, Black Rice, and Kalanamak Rice, helping exporters overcome trade barriers and ensuring fair pricing for premium rice varieties.

Why is India Introducing New HSN Codes for GI-Tagged Rice?

Traditionally, India's rice exports have been classified under **broad HSN codes**, which do not differentiate between general rice and **specialty**, **GI-tagged rice varieties**. This lack of distinction has led to multiple challenges, including:

1. Lack of Recognition for Specialty Rice

- Without unique HSN codes, premium GI-tagged rice varieties get classified under generic categories, reducing their visibility and value in the international market.
- The new codes will ensure that varieties like Red Rice,
 Black Rice, and
 Kalanamak Rice get the recognition they deserve.

2. Difficulty in Trade Policy Implementation

- During export restrictions or tariff changes, generic rice categories often face limitations.
- Having separate HS codes will allow policymakers to

exempt specialty rice from unnecessary trade barriers.

3. Fair Pricing and Market Access

- Exporters often struggle to get the right price for premium varieties because they are bundled with regular rice.
- Dedicated HS codes will help in **better branding**, **pricing**, and marketing for Indian GI rice in global markets.

Key Policy Developments:

1. **September 2024:**

- The Indian government reduced export duty on:
 - Rice in the husk (paddy or rough), husked (brown) rice, and parboiled rice from 20% to 10%.
- The export duty on semimilled or wholly-milled rice (excluding parboiled and Basmati rice) was completely eliminated.

2. October 2024:

- Further boosting rice exports, the government removed export duty on:
 - Parboiled rice and husked rice, making them more accessible in global markets.

41) India Surpasses 100 GW Solar Energy Milestone, Strengthening Global Renewable Leadership

In February 2025, Union Minister Pralhad Joshi, Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) announced

that India has achieved a historic milestone of surpassing 100 Giga Watt (GW) installed solar energy capacity. With this, India consolidates its position as a global leader in Renewable Energy (RE).

- This achievement reflects India's commitment to a cleaner, greener future and marks a major step toward realizing its ambitious target of 500 GW of non-fossil fuel-based energy capacity by 2030 set by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- As per MNRE, India's solar power sector has witnessed an exponential increase of 3450% in capacity over the last 10 years, increasing from 2.82 GW (in 2014) to 100 GW (in 2025).
- As of January 31, 2025, total installed solar energy capacity of India stands at 100.33 GW, with 84.10 GW under implementation and an additional 47.49 GW under tendering.
- Solar energy emerged as the key contributor to India's RE growth, representing 47% of the total installed RE capacity.
- Top 5 performing Indian states, contributing significantly to India's total utility-scale solar installations are: Rajasthan, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu (TN), Maharashtra, and Madhya Pradesh (MP).

On February 11, 2025, President Droupadi Murmu inaugurated an international conference on Unani medicine at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. The event was organized by the Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) under the Ministry of Ayush.

The theme of the conference was: "Innovations in Unani Medicine for Integrative Health Solutions – A Way Forward"

The event coincided with **Unani Day** celebrations, focusing on the importance of **Unani medicine in modern healthcare** and ways to integrate it with contemporary medical advancements.

Significance of Unani Day

 Unani Day is observed every year on February 11 to honor Hakim Ajmal Khan, a legendary Unani physician, freedom fighter, and educationist.

- Hakim Ajmal Khan's contributions:
 - Revitalized and modernized
 Unani medicine in India.
 - Established educational and healthcare institutions.
 - Played a significant role in integrating traditional and modern medicine.
- First observed in 2016, Unani Day recognizes the legacy of Unani medicine and its role in holistic healthcare.
- President Murmu's tribute:
 - Acknowledged Unani medicine's historical significance.
 - Emphasized the need for innovation to keep Unani relevant in modern healthcare.

46) PM Modi's Gifts to French President and First Lady Showcase India's Rich Traditions

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla announced the extension of translation services in the House to six additional languages—Bodo, Dogri, Maithili, Manipuri, Sanskrit, and Urdu. This initiative aims to promote linguistic inclusivity, enhance accessibility for Members of Parliament (MPs), and strengthen democratic participation.

Extension of Translation Services

Newly Added Languages:

- Bodo
- Dogri
- Maithili
- Manipuri
- Sanskrit
- Urdu

These languages have been incorporated **to ensure better communication** for MPs who prefer speaking in their native tongues.

Until now, Lok Sabha translation services were available in **10 languages:**

- Assamese
- Bengali
- Gujarati
- Kannada
- Malayalam
- Marathi
- Odia
- Tamil
- Telugu
- Hindi and English (primary languages of parliamentary proceedings)

With the addition of the new languages, the total number of languages with translation support in the Lok Sabha now stands at 16.

Future Plans for Expansion

- Speaker Om Birla emphasized that eventually, all 22 languages recognized under Schedule 8 of the Indian Constitution will be included in Lok Sabha translation services.
- Implementation will depend on resource availability, technology advancements, and skilled interpreters.
- This move aligns with India's commitment to linguistic inclusivity and cultural diversity in parliamentary proceedings.

47) India's Industrial Output Growth Slows to 3.2% in December 2024

India's **industrial output growth** slowed to **3.2% in December 2024**, down from **5% in November 2024**, according to the

Index of Industrial Production (IIP). The decline was primarily due to weaker manufacturing performance, while electricity generation showed strong growth. This slowdown raises concerns about economic momentum as India enters 2025.

Key Factors Behind the Slowdown in Industrial Growth

The slowdown in **December 2024** was influenced by the **performance of key industrial sectors:**

(a) Manufacturing Sector

- The **manufacturing sector** (which has the largest weight in IIP) grew only **3%** in December 2024.
- In comparison, it grew 4.6% in December 2023, indicating a decline in industrial momentum.

(b) Mining Sector

- **Mining output** growth slowed to **2.6%** in December 2024.
- This was **significantly lower** than the **5.2% growth** recorded in December 2023.

(c) Electricity Sector

- Electricity generation surged 6.2%, much higher than the 1.2% growth recorded in December 2023.
- This reflects **higher power demand**, possibly driven by industrial and infrastructure activity.

48) President's Rule Imposed in Manipur Following CM N. Biren Singh's Resignation

On February 13, 2025, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) imposed President's Rule in Manipur following the resignation of Chief Minister (CM) N Biren Singh. This marks the 11th instance of President's Rule being imposed in the state since its formation in 1951.

• The last instance occurred between June 2, 2001, and March 6, 2002, lasting 277 days.

Resignation:

i. N Biren Singh resigned on February 9, 2025, nearly 21 months after ethnic violence between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities began in May 2023, which resulted in over 250 deaths and the displacement of thousands. ii. He submitted his resignation to Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla at the Raj Bhavan in Imphal, Manipur. iii. He served as the 12th CM of Manipur from March 15, 2017, to February 8, 2025.

Political Instability and Constitutional Deadlines:

i. Due to the growing political instability, the Manipur Assembly, with a tenure lasting until 2027, was placed under suspended animation. ii. According to Article 174(1) of the Indian Constitution, state Assemblies must convene within 6 months of their last session.

iii. The Manipur Assembly was required to reconvene by February 12, 2025, as the last session was held on August 12, 2024.

What is President's Rule?

i. Under **Article 356** of the Indian Constitution, President's Rule suspends the state government, and the Governor assumes executive powers on behalf of the President of India. ii. Under President's Rule, the elected state

government is **dissolved**, and its powers are **suspended**.

iii. The Governor takes over as the executive head of the state, managing the administration on behalf of the President of India.

49) Inauguration of RuTAGe Smart Village Center (RSVC) in Haryana to Boost Rural Innovation

In February 2025, the Rural Technology Action Group (RuTAGe) Smart Village Center (RSVC) was inaugurated in Mandaura village, Sonipat, Haryana. The inauguration was led by Professor Ajay Sood, the Principal Scientific Adviser (PSA) to the Government of India (GoI), alongside key partners:

- Commodore Sridhar Kotra, Founder of the Modern Village Foundation, and
- **DP Goel**, Chairman of the Chaalis Gaon Vikas Parishad.
- The RSVC aims to bridge the gap between rural technological needs and cutting-edge innovations, promoting sustainable development in rural areas.

Key Features:

i. The RSVC serves as a permanent hub for technological integration at the Panchayat level, impacting 15-20 villages over several years and offering a comprehensive range of 12 technology tracks to address diverse rural challenges. ii. The center emphasizes market linkages through collaborations with platforms like:

- Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC)
- Amazon.com, Inc.
- Market Mirchi (a RuTAG innovation by IIT Bombay in Mumbai).

This ensures that **rural producers have** access to larger markets and can sell their goods effectively.

50) Madhya Pradesh Becomes First Indian State to Launch Global Capability Centre (GCC) Policy 2025

Madhya Pradesh (MP) has become the 1st state in India to introduce a dedicated Global Capability Centre (GCC) Policy 2025, positioning itself as a leading hub for global innovation, technology, and business collaboration.

- The Madhya Pradesh State
 Electronics Development
 Corporation Limited (MPSeDC)
 will act as the nodal agency
 responsible for implementing the
 policy.
- A dedicated Policy Implementation Unit (PIU) will manage project approvals, incentive allocation, and compliance monitoring.

Note:

Unveiled ahead of the Global Investors Summit (GIS) 2025 in Bhopal, MP, on 24 and 25 February 2025, the GCC Policy 2025 reinforces MP's role in India's USD 110 billion GCC market vision for 2030.

Objective:

The Madhya Pradesh GCC Policy 2025 aims to transform tier-2 cities like Bhopal, Indore, and Gwalior into global operations centers, providing a competitive advantage to businesses seeking expansion in India.

Key Features:

- i. The focus sectors of the policy include:
 - Information Technology (IT)
 - Finance

- Engineering
- Human Resources (HR)
- Emerging Technologies (ET)
- Special emphasis on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Cybersecurity.

51) Maha Kumbh Mela 2025 - Commemorative Postage Stamps

The Department of Posts (DoP) has released special commemorative souvenir sheet featuring 3 postage stamps dedicated to the Maha Kumbh Mela 2025, which is taking place in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh (UP) from 13th January to 26th **February** 2025. Union Minister **Jyotiraditya** Madhavrao Scindia, Ministry of Communications (MoC),

unveiled these stamps at Arail Ghat Post Office (PO), Prayagraj.

- The commemorative postage stamps, designed by Sankha Samanta, depict 3 prominent of Triveni Tirthaaspects Maharshi Bharadwaj Ashram (an ancient center of learning), Snan (holy dip at Triveni Sangam), and Akshavvat (the immortal Banyan tree).
- Other philatelic releases highlighting Maha Kumbh include special covers and cancellations on sacred Snan days, 'Divya, Bhavya and Digital Mahakumbh', and a picture postcard celebrating 'Prakhyat Prayagraj'.

Note: The Kumbh Mela is rooted in Hindu mythology, linked to the churning of the ocean (Samudra Manthan). **Maha Kumbh occurs once every 144 years** at Prayagraj, UP.

52) Rs 100 Commemorative Coin – Birth Centenary of Mohammed Rafi

The Government of India (GoI) will issue a Rs 100 commemorative coin, to mark the birth centenary of legendary playback singer Padma Shri Mohammed Rafi, which concluded on 24 December 2024. The circular and non-circulating coin is reportedly minted by the India Government Mint (IGM) in Mumbai, Maharashtra.

- The metal composition of the Rs 100 commemorative coin will consist of a Quaternary Alloy, comprising 50% Silver (Ag), 40% Copper (Cu), 5% Nickel (Ni), and 5% Zinc (Zn).
- The coin will weigh **35 grams** (g) and have a diameter of **44**

- millimeters (mm), featuring 200 serrations along the edge.
- On the obverse side, the face of the coin will bear the Lion Capital of Ashoka Pillar in the center with the legend 'Satyameva Jayate' inscription, Rupee symbol (₹) below, and denominational value "100" in the international numerals below it.
- The left and right peripheries of the coin will be flanked with the words "Bharath" in Devanagari script and 'INDIA' in English respectively.
- On the reverse side, the face of the coin will bear Mohammed Rafi's image in the center with inscriptions Birth Centenary of Mohammed Rafi in Devanagari script and English on the upper and lower peripheries respectively, along with the years 1924-2024.

Points to Note:

- Mohammed Rafi (24 December 1924 – 31 July 1980) often referred to as Rafi Sahab was born in Punjab. He was honored with the Padma Shri in 1967 for 'Art'.
- 2. Commemorative coins were earlier issued in honor of legendary singers including Begum Akhtar, a renowned Ghazal artist in 2014, and Dr. M.S. Subbulakshmi, the iconic Carnatic singer in 2017.

53) Historic Renaming: Foy Sagar Now Varun Sagar, King Edward Memorial Transformed

The Rajasthan government has undertaken a significant step towards erasing colonial remnants and restoring cultural pride by renaming two prominent British-era landmarks in Ajmer. The 132-

year-old Foy Sagar Lake has been renamed Varun Sagar, and the 113-year-old King Edward Memorial Bhawan has been rechristened Maharishi Dayanand Vishrant Grih. Rajasthan Assembly Speaker Vasudev Devnani confirmed the renaming and emphasized that these changes reflect India's journey towards embracing its indigenous heritage and honoring its historical and spiritual figures.

Key Highlights of the Renaming

1. Foy Sagar Lake Renamed as Varun Sagar

• Historical Background:

- o The lake was originally named after British engineer **Mr. Foy**, who supervised its construction.
- Built in 1892 during British rule, it was a famine relief project aimed at tackling water scarcity in Ajmer.

• Significance of the New Name:

- Now renamed Varun Sagar after Lord Varun, the Hindu god of water.
- The renaming emphasizes the spiritual and cultural connection to water and nature in Indian traditions.

• **Upcoming Developments:**

- o A **statue of Lord Varun** will be installed at the lake.
- o A ghat (riverbank structure) will be constructed to facilitate prayers and spiritual activities.
- The lake holds special reverence for the **Sindhi community**, who worship it.

2. King Edward Memorial Bhawan Renamed as Maharishi Dayanand Vishrant Grih

• Historical Background:

- o Initially named after **King Edward VII**, who was the
 British monarch from **1901 to 1910**
- The building, located on Railway Station Road, Ajmer, has been a historical landmark in the city.

• Significance of the New Name:

- Renamed in honor of
 Maharishi Dayanand
 Saraswati, the founder of
 the Arya Samaj.
- Maharishi Dayanand attained nirvana in Ajmer, making the renaming highly symbolic.
- The renaming aligns with India's movement to replace symbols of colonial rule with those of national pride and inspiration.

54) Prime Minister Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana – Transforming India's Solar Energy Landscape

On February 2025, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) launched a new digital platform, Mutual Fund Investment Tracing and Retrieval Assistant (MITRA). The new platform is designed to help investors in tracking and reclaiming inactive or unclaimed Mutual Fund (MF) folios.

This platform was introduced through a circular issued by SEBI in exercise of the powers given under Section 11(1) of the SEBI Act 1992, read with the provision of Regulation 77 of SEBI (Mutual

Funds) Regulation, 1996, to protect the interest of the investors in securities and to promote the development of, and to regulate the securities market.

i. As per SEBI circular, the platform will assist with investments that may have been forgotten, lost, or left unclaimed due to outdated Know Your Customer (KYC) details or the demise of the original investor.

ii. The platform will be jointly hosted by two Qualified Registrar and Transfer Agents (QRTAs), i.e., Chennai (Tamil Nadu, TN)-based Computer Age Management Services Limited (CAMS) and Hyderabad (Telangana)-based KFin Technologies Limited. Both these QRTAs will act as agents of Asset Management Companies (AMCs).

iii. SEBI has mandated SEBIregistered brokers to set up a separate business unit (**SBU**) to trade in Government Securities (Gsecs) through the Negotiated Dealing System Order Matching (**NDS-OM**).

54) Government Announces ₹100 Commemorative Coin Honoring Mohammed Rafi's Legacy

To honor the **100th birth anniversary** of legendary playback singer **Mohammed Rafi**, the **Indian government** has announced the release of a ₹100 **commemorative coin**.

 This initiative celebrates Rafi's extraordinary contributions to Indian music and culture, acknowledging his role in shaping Bollywood's golden era of playback singing.

Prime Minister's Tribute

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi paid homage to Mohammed Rafi, calling him a "musical genius whose cultural influence and impact transcend generations."
- The Prime Minister emphasized:
 - Rafi's versatility in singing across different genres, from soulful ghazals to energetic patriotic anthems and romantic melodies.
 - His ability to capture diverse emotions through his songs, making him one of the most celebrated playback singers in India.

55) Dr. Jitendra Singh to Preside Over 12th All India Pension Adalat

Dr. Jitendra Singh, Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, will chair the 12th All India Pension Adalat in New Delhi on February 13, 2025. Organized by the Department of Pension and Pensioners' Welfare (DoPPW), this initiative aims to resolve long-pending pension grievances of retired Central Government employees. With 180 cases under review, the event seeks to provide immediate resolutions to pensioners whose issues have been pending for over 120 days. The Pension Adalat has played a crucial role in grievance redressal since its launch in 2017, significantly improving the efficiency of pension-related dispute settlements.

Objectives and Purpose of the Pension Adalat

The **primary objective** of the 12th All India Pension Adalat is to address and

resolve **long-pending pension grievances** of retired Central Government employees. The session will focus on:

- Reviewing pension-related cases from 16 different Ministries and Departments

60) PM-AASHA Scheme Extended to Support Farmers Until 2025-26

The Government of India has extended the Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakshan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA) scheme until 2025-26 to ensure better income support for farmers. This initiative helps farmers receive remunerative prices for their crops, stabilizes essential food commodity prices, and protects both farmers and consumers from market fluctuations.

Key Components of PM-AASHA

PM-AASHA comprises three major components aimed at ensuring fair prices for agricultural produce and providing income security to farmers:

Price Support Scheme (PSS)

- Under this scheme, the government procures pulses, oilseeds, and copra at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) from pre-registered farmers.
- The procurement is carried out through **designated agencies like**:
 - National Agricultural
 Cooperative Marketing
 Federation of India
 (NAFED)

 - Food Corporation of India (FCI)

- **Objective**: To ensure that **farmers do not suffer losses** due to low market prices and are provided with a **guaranteed minimum price**.
- **Impact**: Protects farmers against price fluctuations and encourages the production of key crops.

Price Stabilization Fund (PSF)

- The Price Stabilization Fund (PSF) is a market intervention mechanism that helps regulate the prices of essential commodities such as pulses and onions.
- The government maintains buffer stocks of pulses and onions using this fund, which are released into the market to control inflation and price volatility.
- Objective:
 - To stabilize consumer prices and prevent farmers from suffering losses due to oversupply or market fluctuations.
 - o To ensure that pulses and onions remain affordable for consumers while maintaining adequate farmer incomes.
- Impact: Reduces price shocks, prevents hoarding and black marketing, and enhances food security.

61) Gujarat Launches G-SAFAL to Uplift 50,000 Underprivileged Women

The Gujarat government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, has launched G-SAFAL (Gujarat Scheme for Antyodaya Families for Augmenting Livelihoods). This flagship initiative aims to empower underprivileged families, especially

women, and promote economic self-sufficiency.

The scheme targets 50,000 Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) cardholder families across 25 talukas in 10 districts of Gujarat over the next five years. It is implemented by the Gujarat Livelihood Promotion Company Limited (GLPCL) under the Rural Development Department.

G-SAFAL focuses on livelihood creation, financial inclusion, and social development, ensuring that the poorest families in Gujarat achieve sustainable economic growth.

69) Centre Releases 15th Finance Commission Grants for Rural Local Bodies

The Union Government has released the Fifteenth Finance Commission (XV FC) grants for the fiscal year 2024–25, providing financial support to Rural Local Bodies (RLBs) in Bihar, Haryana, and Sikkim.

These grants aim to strengthen rural governance by empowering Panchayati

Raj Institutions (PRIs) and enabling them to enhance local administration and service delivery. The funds are distributed as Untied Grants and Tied Grants, ensuring both flexibility and targeted improvements in essential services such as sanitation and water supply.

Financial Assistance Provided to the States

The Finance Commission grants have been distributed to the three states based on specific **eligibility criteria**. The allocations are as follows:

1. Bihar

- Total Allocation: ₹869.7360 crores
 - ₹821.8021 crores as the second installment of Untied Grants.
- Utilization:
 - o 38 District Panchayats
 - o 530 eligible Block Panchayats
 - o 8,052 eligible Gram Panchayats

2. Haryana

- Total Allocation: ₹210.0656 crores
 - o ₹202.4663 crores as the second installment.
 - o ₹7.5993 crores from the withheld first installment.
- Utilization:
 - 18 District Panchayats
 - o 142 Block Panchayats
 - o 6,195 Gram Panchayats

3. Sikkim

• **Total Allocation**: ₹6.2613 crores

- Entire amount granted as the second installment.
- Utilization:
 - 4 eligible District Panchayats
 - o 186 Gram Panchayats

These grants were released **only after the states fulfilled mandatory conditions** set by the Finance Commission, as per the **Press Information Bureau (PIB)**.

70) West Bengal's "Nodi Bandhan" Scheme and Ghatal Masterplan

The West Bengal government, under Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, has introduced the "Nodi Bandhan" scheme in the 2025-26 budget to enhance riverine development and prevent erosion along the Ganga-Padma. Alongside this, significant allocation for the Ghatal Masterplan has been made to address flooding in West Midnapore. These initiatives aim to mitigate natural calamities. boost livelihoods, and strengthen infrastructure in the riverdependent regions of the state.

Key Highlights of the "Nodi Bandhan" Scheme & Ghatal Masterplan

1. Nodi Bandhan Scheme

- Aims to combat natural calamities and enhance livelihoods in riverine areas.
- Will interconnect rivers and wetlands, benefiting pisciculture and irrigation.
- Could lead to the development of small-scale agriculture and fishery-based industries.
- The name "Nodi Bandhan" was coined by Mamata Banerjee herself.

71) Kerala Leads in Scientific Disposal of Expired Medicines

Kerala is set to become the first state in India to implement a scientific system for collecting and disposing of expired and unused medicines from households. The Kerala Drugs Control Department will officially launch the 'nPROUD' (New Programme for Removal of Unused Drugs) initiative on February 22, 2025.

This government-led project is a major step toward environmental sustainability

and public health by ensuring the safe disposal of pharmaceutical waste.

How Will the nPROUD Initiative Work?

The program will begin as a **pilot project** in **Kozhikode Corporation and Ulliyeri Panchayat in Kozhikode district** before being expanded **statewide**.

Three-Step Process for Collection and Disposal:

1. Household Collection

 Government officials will visit homes at designated intervals to collect unused and expired medicines.

2. Permanent Collection Points

 Special blue-colored bins will be placed in public areas for easy disposal.

3. Collaboration with Local Bodies

 Haritha Karma Sena (Green Task Force) and local self-government institutions will help manage collection and logistics.

72) Bengal Leads India in Bird Count for Third Consecutive Year

The Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) is one of the largest global birding events, where birdwatchers from around the world participate in counting species. This year, Bengal once again led the country in bird species recorded, marking its third consecutive victory in the event. Conducted between February 14 and 17, 2025, the exercise saw birdwatchers across India document 1,068 species. Bengal topped the list with 543 species observed, a testament to the state's rich bird diversity and active birdwatching community.

Key Achievements of Bengal in GBBC 2025

- Bengal recorded the **highest number of bird species** in India.
- The state documented **543 species**, the highest in the country.
- Bengal's rich bird diversity and strong birdwatching community played a key role in this success.

Participation Trends

- **Total participation in India:** Over **5,300** birdwatchers.
- Participants from Bengal: 344 birdwatchers contributed to the count.
- The number of uploaded checklists from Bengal was **1,909**, which showed a **decrease** from **2,223** in 2024.
- The decline in participation was mainly due to timing conflicts with academic exams.

Top Observations and Notable Sightings

- Several **rare species** were recorded in Bengal:
 - Ibisbill Spotted in Jhalong (North Bengal).
 - Spotted Crake Found in Baruipur.
 - o Common Starling Seen in Malda.
- Darjeeling recorded the **highest number of species** within Bengal, with **252 species**, though this was lower than **308 species** in 2024.
- South 24 Parganas had the most uploaded checklists (513 checklists).

Top Contributors from Bengal

- Baharuddin Sk emerged as the top observer, recording 310 species.
- Santanu Manna uploaded the highest number of checklists (112 checklists).

73) India's First Wildlife Biobank Opens at Darjeeling Zoo

- India has taken a significant step in wildlife conservation by establishing the country's first zoobased biobank.
- The facility is located at Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park (PNHZP), Darjeeling, West Bengal.
- The biobank became operational in July 2024.
- It is a collaborative project with the Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology (CCMB) under the Ministry of Science and Technology.
- Alongside the biobank, the zoo has also launched an animal museum, further boosting conservation and research efforts.

What is a Biobank?

- The biobank at PNHZP functions as a 'frozen zoo' where genetic materials of endangered species are stored.
- It includes DNA, cellular, and tissue samples from endangered animals.

- These materials are preserved under cryogenic conditions at -196°C using liquid nitrogen.
- This preservation ensures the viability of genetic materials for future scientific research, breeding programs, and potential species revival efforts.

Key Functions of the Biobank

1. Genetic Conservation

- Helps in storing the genetic material of endangered species to prevent species loss.
- Ensures long-term genetic preservation for research and conservation programs.

2. Scientific Research

- Enables wildlife disease studies, population genetics research, and breeding strategies.
- Helps in understanding the genetic diversity of species.

3. Climate Change and Environmental Threats

Acts as a **safeguard** against the **permanent loss of species** due to climate change, habitat destruction, and other environmental threats.

4. Future Breeding and Species Revival

- Can assist in the artificial reproduction of endangered species in the future.
- Holds potential for cloning and assisted reproductive technologies.

Current Status of the Biobank

- As of February 2025, the biobank has collected genetic material from 60 animals across 23 species.
- Focus is on species at the highest risk of extinction.
- The project is part of a **larger national strategy**, with similar biobanks planned at:
 - National Zoological Park, Delhi
 - o Nandankanan Zoological Park, Odisha

Dr. Sonali Ghosh, the Field Director of Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve, highlighted the event's significance, describing it as a spectacular way to experience nature's beauty while raising awareness about environmental conservation.

78) Delhi Cabinet Approves Ayushman Bharat in First Meeting and Other Decisions

Rekha Gupta, BJP leader and first-time MLA from Shalimar Bagh, was sworn in as the ninth Chief Minister of Delhi in a grand ceremony at Ramlila Maidan. In her first

80) Madhya Pradesh Now Home to India's Highest Vulture Population

Madhya Pradesh has recorded India's highest vulture population, reaching 12,981 in the 2025 vulture census, a significant rise from 10,845 in 2024 and 8,397 in 2019. The Madhya Pradesh Forest Department has conducted systematic censuses since 2016, with the 2025 survey split into two phases—the first held in February and the second scheduled for April 29. The survey spans 16 circles, 64 divisions, and 9 protected areas, covering both resident and migratory vulture species. The state is home to seven

of India's nine vulture species, reflecting successful conservation efforts.

81) Recognition of Bathouism in Assam

The **Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR)** government in Assam has included **Bathouism** as an official religion option in application forms for educational institutions, birth, and death certificates. This initiative aims to preserve **indigenous** faiths, particularly the nature-centric beliefs of the Bodo community. The Assam government has also declared the second Tuesday of Magh as a state holiday for Bathou Puja. Bathouism, the traditional faith of the Bodos, revolves around the worship of Bathoubwrai supreme (Sibwrai). the god. emphasizes deep philosophical thought and nature worship.

82) Prime Minister Modi Inaugurates Historic Jhumoir Ensemble in Assam

On February 24, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated 'Jhumoir Binandini 2025' at Guwahati's Sarusajai Stadium, marking the 200th anniversary of Assam's tea industry. The event featured over 8,000 artists from the tea garden community, highlighting Assam's rich cultural heritage.

 - Collected medicines will be scientifically incinerated at the Kerala Enviro Infrastructure Ltd (KEIL) facility in Ernakulam, ensuring compliance with environmental safety norms.

2) India-Qatar to Double Trade to \$28B by 2030

India and Qatar have officially upgraded their bilateral relations to a strategic partnership, focusing on enhanced cooperation in trade, investment, and energy. This milestone decision was taken during the two-day visit of Qatari Amir Sheikh Tamim Bin Hamad Al Thani to India. Both nations have set an ambitious target to double their bilateral trade from \$14.08 billion to \$28 billion over the next five years. Furthermore, Qatar has expressed keen interest in expanding investments across key Indian sectors.

Key Highlights of the India-Qatar Partnership

Bilateral Trade & Investment Goals

- India and Qatar aim to increase bilateral trade to \$28 billion within five years.
- Discussions focused on expanding economic collaboration beyond liquefied natural gas (LNG) and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), where Qatar is India's largest supplier.

3) India Becomes IALA Vice President, Boosts Maritime Leadership

India has been elected as the Vice **President** of the **International** Organization of Aids to Marine Navigation (IALA) during its inaugural General Assembly in Singapore. This signifies India's growing election influence in global maritime affairs and comes at a crucial time when IALA is transitioning from a non-governmental organization (NGO) to an intergovernmental organization (IGO).

With India assuming a leadership position in IALA, the country is set to play a **pivotal role in shaping global maritime navigation policies and governance** in the coming years.

Significance of India's Election as IALA's Vice President

Strengthening Global Maritime Governance

- IALA, established in 1957, has been instrumental in coordinating marine aids to navigation worldwide.
- The organization is responsible for setting global standards for maritime safety and navigation.
- In August 2024, 34 member states ratified IALA's transformation into an IGO, enhancing its ability to regulate and standardize marine navigation globally.
- India's active involvement in this transition reinforces its commitment to strengthening international governance.

4) Philippines Set to Acquire \$200 Million Akash Missile System from India

India is making significant progress in expanding its defense exports, with a \$200 million deal under discussion for supplying the Akash missile system to the Philippines. This deal, expected to be finalized in the current fiscal year, highlights India's growing role in the global defense market and strengthens its strategic ties with the Philippines.

Overview of the Akash Missile System What is the Akash Missile System?

- The Akash missile system is a medium-range surface-to-air missile (SAM) developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).
- It is cost-effective and provides high operational efficiency,

- making it attractive for international buyers.
- The system has been in service with the Indian Army and Indian Air Force since 2009 and has demonstrated high reliability in real-world applications.

Key Features of the Akash Missile System

- Range: Up to 25 kilometers.
- Warhead: 60 kg high-explosive warhead with a proximity fuse for effective target destruction.
- Versatility: Can target aircraft, cruise missiles, and air-to-surface missiles.

- This partnership aims to leverage cutting-edge technologies for the sustainable development of infrastructure.
- **Signatories:** The LoI was signed by

PhD Fellowship Scheme for Telecommunications and Emerging Technologies

- 1. In addition to infrastructure planning, **DoT and ITU signed an agreement** to initiate a 'Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) fellowship scheme' focused on telecommunications and emerging technologies.
- 2. The proposed scheme envisions supporting PhD fellowships over 5 years in ITU focus areas.

7) India to Host BRICS Youth Entrepreneurship Meet in March 2025

India is set to host the BRICS Youth Council **Entrepreneurship** Working Group Meeting from March 3 to 7, 2025, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and themed "Youth Sports. The event. **Entrepreneurship** Sustainable for Growth," will bring together approximately 45 youth representatives from

the **BRICS** nations: **Brazil**, **Russia**, **India**, **China**, **and South Africa**. The focus of the discussions will be on enhancing youth entrepreneurship across these nations, fostering innovation, and creating sustainable growth pathways.

Purpose of the BRICS Youth Entrepreneurship Meeting

The key objectives of this meeting include:

- Establishing the BRICS Youth Council's Entrepreneurship Working Group as a permanent initiative.
- Aligning entrepreneurship efforts across BRICS nations for better coordination and synergy.
- Identifying new strategies for strengthening youth entrepreneurship and promoting global market participation.
- Developing innovative engagement formats to enhance cooperation and collaboration within the BRICS framework.
- Connecting youth entrepreneurs with global business opportunities, them expand their reach.

The ultimate goal is to create a **long-term roadmap for cooperation** among BRICS countries, particularly in the youth entrepreneurship sector.

8) EAM Jaishankar Chief Guest of the 1st Raisina Middle East Conference

The first Raisina Middle East Conference was held in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) capital city, Abu Dhabi, on 28 and 29 January 2025. External Affairs Minister Dr S. Jaishankar was the Chief Guest of the first Raisina Middle East Conference.

- Dr S.Jaishankar was on a threeday official visit to the UAE on 27 and 29 January 2025.
- This was the third visit to the UAE
 by Dr Jaishankar since he was

- reappointed as the External Affairs Minister in June 2024.
- The Raisina Dialogue is India's premier conference on geopolitics and geoeconomics which brings together experts to discuss the most challenging issues facing the world community.

Niger Achieves Historic Milestone: First African Nation to Eliminate Onchocerciasis

On January 30, 2025, the World Health **Organization** (WHO) announced that Niger has become the first country in the African region to officially eliminate onchocerciasis, also known as river blindness, as a public health threat. This remarkable achievement places Niger alongside just four other countries globally—Colombia, Ecuador. Guatemala, and Mexico—that have successfully halted the transmission of the parasitic disease. It marks a significant moment in public health, especially for sub-Saharan Africa, where onchocerciasis has long been a major concern. According to WHO, Niger's success reflects the progress made in controlling and eliminating neglected tropical diseases.

Global Context:

Niger joins only four other countries globally—
 Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, and Mexico—that have successfully halted the transmission of onchocerciasis.

What is Onchocerciasis (River Blindness)?

• Cause: A parasitic worm transmitted by the bite of infected blackflies.

- Symptoms: Can cause severe itching, skin rashes, and, in severe cases, blindness.
- Impact: It is the second-leading infectious cause of blindness globally and affects millions in sub-Saharan Africa, especially rural communities near fast-flowing rivers where blackflies breed.

9) Trump Effect :US Withdraw from UNHRC & Stop Funding of UNRWA

Donald Trump, the 47th President of the United States of America, has signed an executive order to withdraw the country from the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) and permanently stop the funding of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA). He has also ordered the review of the American contribution to UNESCO and the funding of the United Nations.

Executive Order by Donald Trump (February 2025):

- Withdrawal from UNHRC: The U.S. has withdrawn from the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC), a move that mirrors Trump's previous decision in 2018. The U.S. had rejoined under President Biden in 2021 but did not seek a second term in 2023.
- Withdrawal from UNRWA
 Funding: The U.S. has suspended
 funding to the United Nations
 Relief and Works Agency for
 Palestinian Refugees (UNRWA),
 a policy initially adopted by Trump
 in 2018 and later reversed by Biden.
 The U.S. is the largest donor to the
 agency.

Impact:

- UNHRC: The U.S. was not a member of the UNHRC at the time of withdrawal but had informal observer status. The decision will not immediately impact the council's operations.
- UNRWA: The U.S. suspension of funding will significantly affect the UNRWA's operations, as it is the largest donor to the agency. The agency provides essential services like health, education, and food to Palestinian refugees.

The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) is an intergovernmental body within the United Nations (UN) responsible for the promotion and protection of human rights worldwide.

Key Details of UNHRC *Establishment:*

 Established in 2006 by the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), replacing the United Nations Commission on Human Rights (1946–2006).

Functions:

- Promotes and protects human rights globally.
- Reviews **human rights violations** and makes recommendations.
- Conducts Universal Periodic Review (UPR) to assess the human rights records of all UN member states.
- Works with special rapporteurs and working groups to address specific human rights issues.

Membership:

10) After US Exit, Argentina Cuts Ties with WHO

Argentina has announced its decision to withdraw from the World Health Organization (WHO), following a similar move by the United States under former President Donald Trump. The decision, made under the leadership of President Javier Milei, has sparked significant debate both domestically and internationally. - Objective: The roadmap aims to create a multi-sectoral action plan addressing road safety management, vehicular regulations, school safety initiatives, and enhanced post-crash care.
- Key Statistics:
 - Daily Fatalities: On average, 45 children under
 18 years old lose their lives in road crashes daily.
 - o Annual Fatalities: 16,443 children died in road crashes in 2022 alone.
 - Non-Fatal Injuries: 5
 million children suffer
 non-fatal injuries requiring
 hospitalization each year.
 - Total Fatalities (2011-2022): Approximately 1.98 lakh children and adolescents lost their lives in road crashes, with 75% of fatalities among 14-17 year-olds.

In February 2025, Union Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, Ministry of Power (MoP) and Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MOHUA); and Ed Miliband, Secretary for the Department of Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) for the United Kingdom (UK), co-chaired the 4th India-UK Energy Dialogue in New Delhi (Delhi).

 During this dialogue, both nations reviewed the progress made in the energy sectors, including power and renewable energy (RE), and also reaffirmed their commitment to a sustainable, resilient, and inclusive energy future.

19) Mount Dukono erupts in Indonesia

Mount Dukono, one of Indonesia's most active volcanoes, erupted on February 20, 2025, spewing a massive ash cloud up to 2,000 meters into the air. The eruption, occurring on Halmahera Island in North Maluku province, has prompted Indonesian authorities to issue urgent aviation warnings safety advisories and for residents.

The Volcanology and Geological Disaster Mitigation Centre (PVMBG) raised the alert level, warning aircraft to maintain a 5-kilometer distance from the volcano due to the risk of volcanic ash interfering with flights. Local communities have also been advised to stay at least 4 kilometers away from the active Malupang Warirang crater and take necessary precautions, including wearing face masks to avoid inhaling ash particles.

20) UAE Introduces Blue Visa: 10-Year Residency for Foreigners

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has launched the first phase of the Blue Visa, a 10-year residency permit aimed at individuals contributing to environmental sustainability and climate action. The initiative was announced during the World Governments Summit 2025 in Dubai (February 11-13) by the Ministry of Climate Change and Environment (MoCCAE) in collaboration with the Federal Authority for Identity,

Citizenship, Customs, and Ports Security (ICP).

Key Features of the UAE Blue Visa

- **Residency Duration**: 10 years.
- Target Group:
 - Environmental innovators and sustainability leaders.
 - Members of international organizations and NGOs.
 - Corporate leaders in environmental protection.

1) Indian Banks' Margins to Drop 10 Bps in FY26

According to Fitch Ratings, Indian banks are expected to witness a 10 basis points (bps) decline in their net interest margins (NIMs) in the financial year 2025-26. This decline follows the Reserve Bank of India (RBI)'s decision to cut the key policy rate by 25 basis points (bps) to 6.25% in February 2025, marking the first rate cut in nearly five years. While this move is aimed at stimulating economic growth, it presents challenges for banks by squeezing their margins due to lower lending rates.

1. Impact of RBI's Rate Cut on Loans and Interest Margins

A. Floating Rate Loans and Interest Earnings

- Immediate Effect: The rate cut will lower the interest rates on floating rate loans linked to external benchmarks such as the repo rate, treasury bill rates, or other market-linked indicators.
- Key Sectors Affected:
 - Housing loans
 - o Small and Medium Enterprise (SME) loans
 - Retail borrowing and commercial loans
- Bank Earnings Impact:
 - With lower lending rates, banks will earn less interest on new loans, leading to a direct reduction in interest income.
 - Non-Banking Financial Institutions (NBFIs), particularly those engaged in urban housing and commercial loans, will also

experience a **decline in** yields.

B. Increased Competition and Profitability Challenges

- Banks will face heightened competition as lending rates decline, forcing them to lower their interest rates to attract borrowers.
- Reduced profitability is expected, as banks struggle to maintain existing margins while accommodating lower interest rates.

2) Wholesale Price Index (WPI) for January 2025: Inflation Rate and Key Highlights

The Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has released the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) for January 2025, reporting an annual inflation rate of 2.31% (provisional) compared to January 2024. The rise in inflation is primarily attributed to increasing prices in manufactured food products, food articles, non-food articles, and textiles. However, on a month-overmonth (MoM) basis, WPI declined by (-) 0.45%, indicating a marginal drop in wholesale prices from December 2024 to January 2025.

Key Trends in WPI Components for January 2025

The Wholesale Price Index (WPI) is classified into three major categories: Primary Articles, Fuel & Power, and Manufactured Products. The trends observed in these categories for January 2025 are as follows:

1. Primary Articles (Weight: 22.62%)

The index for Primary Articles declined by 2.01%, dropping from 193.8 (December 2024) to 189.9 (January 2025, provisional).

- Food Articles: Prices fell by 3.62% in January 2025 compared to December 2024.
- Crude Petroleum & Natural Gas: Prices increased by 6.34%, indicating rising energy costs.
- **Non-Food Articles:** Prices recorded an increase of **0.66%**.
- Minerals: A marginal increase of 0.22% was observed.

2. Fuel & Power (Weight: 13.15%)

The index for Fuel & Power increased by 0.47%, rising from 149.9 (December 2024) to 150.6 (January 2025, provisional).

- Mineral Oils: Prices rose by 0.71%.
- **Electricity:** Prices increased by **0.20%**.
- **Coal:** Prices remained **unchanged** compared to December 2024.

3. Manufactured Products (Weight: 64.23%)

The index for Manufactured Products increased by 0.14%, from 143.0 (December 2024) to 143.2 (January 2025, provisional).

- Out of 22 manufacturing subsectors, 15 groups recorded price increases, 5 groups recorded price declines, and 2 groups remained unchanged.

3) Indian Export touch a historic high of USD 778.21 billion in 2023-24

According to the Union Ministry of Commerce, Indian exports (merchandise and service in 2023-24 touched a historic high of USD 778.21 billion. The total exports from India in 2022-23 was USD 776.3 billion.

In 2013-14, the total export from India was USD 466.22 billion and it will grow by 67 % to USD 778.21 billion in 2023-24.

Break up of the Export in 2023-24

The export is divided into merchandise goods(tangible) and services (intangible).

The total merchandise export from India in 2023-24 was **USD 437.10 billion**. In 2013-14 it was USD 314 billion

The service sector export in 2023-24 was **USD 341.11 billion**. In 2013-14 it

was USD 152 billion. The increase in exports has been driven by strong performance in information technology, financial, and business services.

Merchandise Export Destination in 2023-24

In 2023-24, the major export destination for Indian merchandise goods was the **United States of America** with a share of 17.90 in total Indian exports.

The other major export destinations for merchandise goods in the descending orders are the **United Arab Emirates** (8.23%), Netherlands (5.16%), China (3.85%), Singapore (3.33%), UK (3.00%), Saudi Arabia (2.67%), Bangladesh (2.55%), Germany (2.27%), and Italy (2.02%).

4) Union Budget 2025-26: Focus on Growth, Fiscal Discipline, and Social Welfare; Here's a detailed analysis

The Union Budget 2025-26 outlines a comprehensive framework for India's economic growth, focusing on infrastructure, inclusive development, fiscal prudence, and job creation. 5) India's Retail Inflation Drops to 4.31% in January 2025

India's retail inflation, measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), eased to 4.31% in January 2025, marking its lowest level in five months. This is a decline from 5.22% in December 2024, bringing relief to consumers and policymakers. The fall in inflation is primarily attributed to a slowdown in food

prices, particularly **vegetables**, as fresh winter supplies entered the market.

Reasons Behind the Inflation Decline in January 2025

The **easing of inflation** in January was mainly driven by the **food price slowdown** and **monetary policy measures**:

(a) Food Price Inflation Decline

- Food inflation fell to 6.02% in January 2025, down from 8.39% in December 2024.
- Vegetable prices, which surged 26.6% year-on-year in December, only rose by 11.35% in January.
- The availability of fresh seasonal produce (such as winter vegetables) led to a stabilization of food costs.

(b) Role of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in Easing Inflation

- The RBI reduced its key policy rate by 25 basis points (bps) to 6.25%, marking its first rate cut in nearly five years.
- This move was aimed at supporting economic growth while inflation showed signs of moderation.

6) India's Q3 FY25 GDP Growth Set at 6.4%

India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew by 6.2% in the third quarter (Q3) of the fiscal year 2024-25 (October-December 2024), according to official data released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) on February 28, 2025. This marks an acceleration from the 5.6% growth observed in the previous quarter (Q2).

Sectoral Performance:

- **Agriculture:** The agriculture sector experienced a growth rate of 4.0% in Q3 FY25.
- **Industry:** The industrial sector expanded by 6.2% during the same period.
- **Services:** The services sector led the growth with a 7.7% increase in Q3 FY25.

These figures indicate a broad-based recovery across major sectors of the economy.

Factors Contributing to Growth:

- Government Spending: Increased public expenditure, particularly in infrastructure and social welfare, has bolstered economic activity.
- Export Revival: A significant rebound in exports, especially in services, has contributed to the overall economic momentum.
- **Domestic Demand:** Strong rural consumption, supported by a bountiful harvest, has played a crucial role in driving growth

7) India's Road to High-Income Status by 2047

India is on track to become a highincome nation by 2047, with its GDP projected to reach between \$23 trillion and \$35 trillion, according to a recent report by Bain & Company in collaboration with Nasscom. The services sector is expected to be the biggest contributor, making up 60% of GDP, manufacturing will account for 32%. The highlights report that technology, workforce expansion, and strategic investments in key sectors will play a crucial role in India's economic transformation.

GDP Projection:

- Expected to reach \$23 trillion to \$35 trillion by 2047.
- Services sector will contribute 60% of GDP, while manufacturing will account for 32%.

Workforce & Employment:

- **200 million** people will join the workforce in the next two decades.
- A **50** million workforce shortfall is predicted by 2030 if skill development is not prioritized.
- Focus on vocational training, STEM education, and digital literacy is essential.

8) India's GDP Growth to Slow to 6.4% in 2025: Moody's

India's economic growth is expected to slow down to 6.4% in 2025, according to a report by Moody's Analytics. This marks a slight decline from the 6.6% GDP growth in 2024. The report highlights key global factors affecting the slowdown, including new U.S. tariffs and weakening global demand, which are expected to impact India's exports. The Asia-Pacific region is also witnessing reduced growth, with China's GDP projected to fall from 5% in 2024 to 4.2% in 2025.

9) India's Economic Growth to Reach 6.4% in FY25 and FY26

India's economic growth is set to expand at 6.4% in both FY25 and FY26, according to the latest forecast by S&P Global Market Intelligence. This estimate reflects steady progress despite global economic challenges and domestic policy shifts. While the projection aligns closely with the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) forecast of 6.6% for FY25, it is slightly lower than S&P Global Ratings' earlier estimate of 6.8%. The report highlights how key monetary and fiscal policies, inflation trends, and government expenditure will influence this growth.

Growth Projection:

- 6.4% GDP growth in both FY25 and FY26 (S&P Global Market Intelligence).
- Close to RBI's forecast of 6.6% but lower than S&P Global Ratings' 6.8% estimate.

Monetary & Fiscal Policies Driving Growth:

- RBI cut policy repo rate by 25 basis points to 6.25% (Feb 2025)—first cut in five years.
- Expected another 25 basis point cut in April 2025 to boost investment.
- 2025 Union Budget tax relief aims to increase disposable income and spending.

1) SIDBI and AFD Sign \$100 Million Green Finance Deal to Boost Sustainable Growth in MSMEs

SIDBI and French Development Agency Sign USD 100 Million Green Finance Deal for MSMEs

On February 12, 2025, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh (UP)-based Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) and Paris (France)-based French Development Agency (Agence Française de Développement, AFD) signed a USD 100 million Credit Facility Agreement (CFA) to enhance green finance solutions for India's Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs).

 This collaboration aims to support sustainable growth and facilitate the transition towards a low-carbon economy by providing affordable financing.

Key Points:

- i. The AFD will provide a credit line of **USD 100 million** to SIDBI to deploy the funds to expand access to affordable financing for MSMEs investing in energy-efficient technologies, renewable energy solutions, and climate-friendly business practices.
- ii. **Green Finance:** This collaboration focuses on **green finance**, which refers to financing that supports projects or businesses working to reduce their environmental impact.
- iii. **Low-carbon Economy:** The aim is to help businesses shift to a **low-carbon economy** that produces fewer greenhouse gases and relies more on renewable energy.

iv. MSMEs have a vital role to play in India's commitment to achieving carbon neutrality by 2070, and this initiative also complements the work on the **Greening Indian Financial System (GIFS) Platform.**

v. The **GIFS Platform** focuses on integrating sustainability and a climate perspective into the strategies of Indian financial stakeholders.

2) RBI Fines Shriram Finance, Ujjivan SFB, and Nainital Bank for Violations

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed monetary penalties on three financial institutions—Shriram Finance, Ujjivan Small Finance Bank, and The Nainital Bank Limited—for regulatory non-compliance. These penalties were imposed under the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, following RBI's Inspection for Supervisory Evaluation (ISE 2023), which assessed the financial health of these institutions as of March 31, 2023. The violations included non-adherence to interest rate guidelines, improper loan documentation, and lapses in risk categorization.

Reasons for RBI's Penalties

1. The Nainital Bank Limited – ₹61.40 lakh penalty

- The bank failed to benchmark floating rate loans to Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) against an external benchmark rate, as per RBI's guidelines.
- Violated RBI's norms on 'Interest Rate on Advances' and 'Customer Service in Banks.'
- Instead of charging customers a proportionate fee for nonmaintenance of minimum balance, the bank imposed a fixed

penalty, which was against RBI's fair banking practices.

2. Ujjivan Small Finance Bank – ₹6.70 lakh penalty

- The bank did not issue loan agreements to some borrowers at the time of loan disbursement, violating RBI's policy on 'Loans and Advances – Statutory and Other Restrictions.'
- This failure compromised borrower rights and financial transparency, leading to regulatory action.

3. Shriram Finance – ₹5.80 lakh penalty

- The company did not implement a system to periodically review risk categorization of customer accounts, which is essential for regulatory compliance.
- This failure increased risks related to financial fraud, money laundering, and inadequate risk assessment.

3) IRDAI's 'Bima Trinity' Initiative: Transforming India's Insurance Landscape

The Insurance Regulatory and **Development** Authority India (**IRDAI**) has unveiled a revolutionary plan called Bima Trinity during the 9th Bima Manthan, held on February 13-14, 2025. This initiative is set to transform India's insurance industry, aiming to make insurance more accessible, affordable, and efficient. The plan, a three-pronged approach, is designed to address critical gaps in insurance accessibility coverage across the country. The 9th Bima **Manthan** meeting was an important platform where IRDAI engaged with the CEOs of insurance companies to discuss the performance of the sector and its future strategies.

Key Components of Bima Trinity

Bima Trinity is a **three-pronged strategy** consisting of:

1. Bima Sugam (Unified Digital Marketplace)

- A **one-stop digital platform** for all insurance-related activities, including buying, servicing, and claiming policies.
- Provides a centralized interface where all insurance companies, policyholders, and agents can interact.
- Aims to reduce paperwork, enhance transparency, and speed up claim settlements.
- Consumers can compare different insurance products from various insurers on a single platform.
- **Impact**: Simplifies insurance access and improves efficiency in policy management.

Bima Vistaar (Comprehensive Insurance Product)

- A bundled insurance product covering:
 - **Life Insurance** (financial security for families).
 - Accident Cover

 (compensation for accidental injuries or death).
 - Property Protection (covering damages to homes and assets).
 - Health Insurance (hospitalization and medical expenses).

- Reduces the need for multiple insurance policies by offering comprehensive coverage in a single plan.
- Designed to be affordable and easy to understand, making it accessible to all income groups.
- **Impact**: Ensures holistic protection for individuals and families while simplifying policy management.

4) LIC Unveils 'One Man Office' to Digitally Empower Agents

The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) launched a new digital initiative called the 'One Man Office' (OMO) on February 17, 2025. This initiative aims to enhance the efficiency of LIC agents by providing 24×7 digital services and aligns with LIC's long-term vision of 'Insurance for All by 2047'.

This mobile digital office allows LIC agents to manage policy sales, customer service, and business operations seamlessly, ensuring greater independence and productivity without requiring a traditional office setup.

Key Objectives of 'One Man Office'

- Empowering LIC agents with digital tools to manage their business efficiently.
- Enhancing customer service through quick and seamless policy transactions.
- Supporting LIC's digital transformation and reducing dependence on physical offices.
- Contributing to the 'Insurance for All by 2047' vision, expanding insurance penetration across India.
- **Boosting LIC's business growth** by enabling more agents to operate digitally.

5) SEBI launches 'Related Party Transaction (RPT) portal'

On February 14, 2025, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) launched the 'Related Party Transaction (RPT) portal', India's first dedicated platform to monitor and analyze RPTs. The portal aims to enhance transparency and governance in corporate India.

 The portal enables a wide range of stakeholders to access standardized and comparable data on RPTs.

Note: RPT is a transaction between related parties that involves the transfer of resources, services, or obligations between them, regardless of whether a price is charged.

Key Points:

- 1. **SEBI clarified** that executive compensation will be covered under RPTs, allowing promoters to reward themselves without shareholder approval.
- 2. The portal compiles comprehensive information on RPTs, including shareholding voting patterns from the last 2 years, helping investors make well-informed decisions.
- 3. The platform **fixes information gaps** and improves corporate governance in India.
- The portal will be maintained by three proxy advisories:
 - InGovern Research
 Services Pvt. Ltd.
 (Bengaluru, Karnataka)
 - Institutional Investor
 Advisory Services India
 Ltd. (IiAS) (Mumbai,
 Maharashtra)

- Stakeholders
 Empowerment Services
 (SES) (Mumbai, Maharashtra)
- The portal allows investors to track RPTs and access opinions on transactions.
- 5. **Retail investors** now have access to this information, which was earlier limited to institutional investors.

6) NPCI introduces a new rule for managing chargebacks in UPI transactions

In February 2025, the Mumbai-based National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) introduced a new rule for managing chargebacks in Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transactions.

- As per the new UPI rule, chargebacks will be automatically accepted or rejected based on Transaction Credit Confirmation (TCC) and Return Requests (RET) raised by beneficiary banks in the next settlement cycle.
- This new feature is implemented in the UPI Dispute Resolution System (URCS) from February 15, 2025.

Note:

A chargeback is a process that reverses a **completed UPI transaction** due to disputes, fraud, or technical errors. It is initiated by the payer's bank, and if approved, the transaction is returned to the payer.

Need for the New Mechanism:

1. Earlier, chargebacks started from 'T+0', causing issues for banks in reconciling transactions.

2. Some chargebacks were **closed automatically**, leading to penalties by the **Reserve Bank of India** (**RBI**).

Key Highlights of the New Mechanism:

- 1. The new UPI rule applies to bulk upload options and Unified Dispute Resolution Interface (UDIR), excluding front-end dispute resolution.
- 2. **Beneficiary banks** will now have the chance to **reconcile transactions efficiently** before chargebacks are deemed approved.

7) Exim Bank to provide USD 300 million credit to Vietnam

In February 2025, the Mumbai-based **Export-Import Bank of India (EXIM Bank)** announced a **USD 300 million Line of Credit (LoC) to Vietnam** for **high-speed boats and offshore patrol vessels**.

- In July 2024, EXIM Bank signed an agreement with Vietnam's Government (GO-VNM) for a USD 180 million LoC for 4 Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPV).
- Another agreement committed USD 120 million for high-speed guard boats.
- 1. Both agreements are **effective from January 20, 2025**.
- 2. The last date for disbursement is 60 months after project completion.

8) RBI Approves Small Finance Banks to Offer Pre-Sanctioned Credit Lines via UPI from February 12, 2025

In February 2025, Small Finance Banks (SFBs) received the Reserve Bank of

India (RBI) approval to provide presanctioned credit lines through the Unified Payments Interface (UPI). This move, effective from February 12, 2025, aligns with the RBI's December 2024 announcement during the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting.

- UPI, India's real-time payment system developed by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), previously allowed transactions via savings accounts, overdrafts, prepaid wallets, and credit cards.
- The RBI has now expanded this to include pre-sanctioned credit lines issued by SFBs, enabling instant access to credit for individuals and small businesses.
- The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) is a digital payment tool that can help achieve the goals of the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) and promote equitable economic growth.

Background:

In **September 2023**, RBI expanded the scope of UPI by enabling **pre-sanctioned credit lines** to be linked through UPI. However, this feature was limited to **commercial banks**, excluding **Payments Banks**, **Small Finance Banks** (**SFBs**), and **Regional Rural Banks** (**RRBs**).

Transparent Credit Access:

i. Customers must provide **explicit consent** before availing of credit lines, ensuring transparency. Terms such as credit limits, interest rates, and repayment tenure are determined by individual **SFBs** under their board-approved policies. ii. The facility aims to serve 'new-to-credit' (NTC) customers, including farmers, small entrepreneurs, and rural

businesses, reducing reliance on informal lenders charging exorbitant rates. iii. It is required for customers to review the terms and conditions of the credit lines before usage.

9) South Indian Bank launches 'SIB Ouick FD'

On February 14, 2025, Thrissur (Kerala)-based South Indian Bank Limited (SIB) launched 'SIB Quick FD', a new digital service that allows individuals to open Fixed Deposits (FDs) without a savings account in the bank.

- This initiative aims to offer a hassle-free and convenient digital banking experience for both existing and new customers.
- It offers digital-first solutions that cater to the evolving needs of customers with minimal setup, affordable entry amounts, and insured deposits ensuring a secure, simple, and convenient investment experience.

Key Features of 'SIB Quick FD'

10) SBI Introduces 'SBI Patrons' Term Deposit Scheme for Super Senior Citizens

In January 2025, the State Bank of India (SBI) launched a new Term Deposit (TD) scheme called 'SBI Patrons' for Super Senior Citizens, defined as residents aged 80 years or above. The scheme offers additional interest benefits, with an interest rate 10 basis points (0.10%) higher than the rates provided to senior citizens.

Key Features:

- 1. **Interest Rates**: The scheme offers interest rates ranging from 4.10% to 7.60%. For example, the 1-year TD rate is 7.4%, and the 5-year TD rate is 7.6% for super senior citizens.
- 2. **Deposit Options**: The scheme offers Term Deposit Receipt (TDR) and Short-Term Deposit Receipt

(STDR) options with a minimum deposit of Rs. 1,000 and a maximum deposit of up to Rs. 3 crore. The tenure for deposits ranges from 7 days to 10 years.

3. **Penalty** for Premature Withdrawal: A penalty of 0.50% applies for premature withdrawals up to Rs. 5 lakh, and 1% for amounts exceeding Rs. 5 lakh.

This initiative aims to provide super senior citizens with better returns on their savings, supporting their financial stability in their later years.

11) RBI Tightens Norms for Monetary Penalties and Compounding Offences under Payment and Settlement Systems Act (PSS Act, 2007)

In January 2025, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) introduced stricter norms for imposing monetary penalties and compounding offences under Payment and Settlement Systems Act (PSS Act, 2007). This new framework aims **to** streamline and strengthen enforcement actions against payment **system operators and banks** for violations such as operating without authorization, disclosing prohibited information, and failing to pay penalties within prescribed time.

Key Provisions:

- 1. **Penalty Provisions**: As per Section 30 of the PSS Act, RBI can now impose penalties up to Rs 10 lakh or twice the amount involved in the contravention (whichever is higher), where the amount is quantifiable.
- 2. Compounding of Offences: Under Section 31 of the Act, RBI officers are authorized to compound contraventions, except for offences punishable with imprisonment or

both imprisonment and fine. This change aims to ensure more effective regulatory oversight and quicker resolutions in cases of noncompliance.

12) NPCI Implements New Rules for UPI Transaction ID from February 1, 2025

The National Payments Corporation of (NPCI) has introduced India regulations for **Unified Payments** Interface (UPI) transactions, which came into effect on February 1, 2025. Under the guidelines, all UPI transaction **IDs** containing special characters (such as @, #, \$, %, etc.) will be declined, and only alphanumeric characters will permitted.

Key Points:

- 1. Enforcement of Alphanumeric Only **Transaction** IDs: The UPI regulation mandates that transaction IDs must exclusively alphanumeric characters. use aligning with technical specifications set by NPCI in March 2024.
- 2. Compliance with Technical Standards: The move follows NPCI's earlier Operating Circular (OC 193) from March 2024, which called for standardizing transaction IDs to facilitate smoother operations across UPI platforms.
- 3. **System Updates for Compliance**: Banks, payment service providers, and third-party applications (apps) are required to update their systems in accordance with the new rules before the enforcement date.

13) Ujjivan Small Finance Bank Seeks Universal Banking Licence

Ujjivan Small Finance Bank (USFB) has applied for a **universal banking licence**,

marking a significant milestone in its transition from a small finance bank to a full-fledged commercial bank. This move is part of the bank's strategy to expand its financial services, enhance regulatory flexibility, and strengthen its market position.

- 4. Possess a diversified loan portfolio.

- 1. \$5 Billion USD/INR Forex Swap
 Auction
- Open Market Operations
 (OMOs) Worth ₹60,000 Crore
- 3. Variable Rate Repo (VRR)
 Auction Worth ₹50,000 Crore
- 1. RBI's \$5 Billion Forex Swap Auction (January 31, 2025)
 - The USD/INR buy/sell swap auction, conducted on January 31, 2025, was aimed at infusing liquidity into the banking system.
 - Why was it needed?
 - The falling rupee and dollar shortages had tightened liquidity.
 - The auction allowed banks to access more rupees, supporting their liquidity needs.

• Outcome of the Auction:

- o The auction saw huge demand, receiving bids worth \$25.59 billion (oversubscribed five times by 253 participants).
- The RBI sold \$5 billion in exchange for rupees, thereby absorbing excess rupee liquidity from the system.

 The six-month maturity of the swap ensures that banks can manage their forex needs efficiently.

• Impact on Financial Stability:

- This step will provide shortterm relief to the banking system by easing liquidity shortages.
- It will help control volatility in the forex market and maintain the stability of the rupee.
- 2. Open Market Operations (OMOs) ₹60,000 Crore in Three Phases
 - OMOs involve the RBI buying or selling government securities to regulate the money supply.
 - To further ease liquidity constraints, the RBI announced OMOs worth ₹60,000 crore in three parts:
 - January 30, 2025 ₹20,000
 crore
 - February 13, 2025 –₹20,000 crore
 - February 20, 2025 –
 ₹20,000 crore

Why OMOs?

 By buying government securities, the RBI injects liquidity into the economy. This helps in reducing interest rate fluctuations and ensures credit availability for businesses.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed monetary penalties on Federal Bank Ltd and Karur Vysya Bank Ltd for non-compliance with regulatory guidelines. Federal Bank has been fined ₹27.30 lakh, while Karur Vysya Bank faces a penalty of ₹8.30 lakh. This action follows RBI's routine inspections, which identified violations in management and credit delivery systems. These penalties highlight RBI's firm stance on maintaining strict banking compliance.

22) RBI to Issue ₹50 Banknotes with Governor Sanjay Malhotra's Signature

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced the issuance of new ₹50 denomination banknotes featuring the signature of its newly appointed Governor, Sanjay Malhotra. Malhotra took over as the 26th RBI Governor in December 2024, succeeding Shaktikanta Das.

The **new ₹50 notes** will maintain the **existing design** under the **Mahatma Gandhi (New) Series**, ensuring continuity in India's currency framework. **All previously issued ₹50 notes will remain legal tender**, as confirmed by the RBI.

Sanjay Malhotra assumed office as RBI Governor in December 2024, following the end of Shaktikanta Das's extended tenure.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed monetary penalties on Citibank N.A., Asirvad Micro Finance, and JM Financial Home Loans for failing to comply with key regulatory norms. According to the central bank, these financial institutions were found violating guidelines related to large exposures, credit information reporting, and disclosure requirements. The penalties were issued following an inspection of their financial positions as of March 31, 2023.

Penalties and Violations:

Citibank N.A. – ₹39 lakh fine

- **Violation:** Failed to comply with the **Large Exposures Framework**.
- Issues Identified:
 - Did not report breaches within the mandated timeframe.
 - Delayed correction of data in Credit Information Companies (CICs), exceeding the 7-day limit set by RBI.

Asirvad Micro Finance – ₹6.20 lakh fine

Violations:

- Failed to report household incomes of borrowers to CICs
- Did not provide gold loan customers with mandatory factsheets.
- Lacked an automatic escalation mechanism for grievance redressal.

JM Financial Home Loans – Penalty details not specified

 RBI noted compliance issues, but specific details of violations are yet to be disclosed.

27) RBI's OMO Auction Sees ₹1.87 Trillion Bids Amid Liquidity Crunch

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Open Market Operation (OMO) purchase auction on February 20, 2025, witnessed an overwhelming response from banks and financial institutions. Against an offer of ₹40,000 crore, the auction received bids worth ₹1.87 trillion, highlighting the acute liquidity deficit in the banking system. 34) SBI Cuts India's FY25 GDP Growth Forecast to 6.3%

India's economic growth is expected to slow down in the fiscal year 2024-25, with the State Bank of India (SBI) revising its GDP growth estimate to 6.3%. This is lower than the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) projection of 6.6% and a significant drop from last year's growth rate of 8.2%. The downgrade is attributed to weaker manufacturing growth and subdued private investment, both of which have raised concerns about the overall economic trajectory.

35) RBI Reverses Higher Risk Weights on Bank Loans to NBFCs and Microloans

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has decided to reverse its 2023 decision to increase risk weights on bank loans to non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) due to the slowdown in bank credit growth. This move, effective from April 1, 2025, is expected to free up capital for banks, improve lending to NBFCs, and provide clarity on risk weights for microloans.

Key Highlights of the RBI's Announcement

1. Risk Weights on Bank Loans to NBFCs

- In November 2023, RBI had increased risk weights by 25 percentage points on bank loans to NBFCs.
- This meant that banks had to hold more capital against loans to NBFCs, making lending more expensive.
- Reversal of the 2023 decision:
 - Risk weights will now be based on the external credit rating of the NBFC rather than a fixed higher rate.
 - This will reduce capital requirements for banks and encourage higher lending to NBFCs.
 - Expected to improve liquidity in the NBFC sector and support credit flow to retail borrowers.

2. Impact of the November 2023 Risk Weight Hike

- The increase in risk weights led to a sharp decline in credit growth to NBFCs:
 - December 2023: Bank credit growth to NBFCs was 15%.
 - December 2024: It dropped significantly to 6.7%.
- Overall bank loan growth also slowed down during the same period:
 - December 2023: 20%
 - o **December 2024:** 11.2%
- As a result, NBFCs had to seek alternative funding sources, such as:

- Capital markets (issuing bonds and other instruments).
- External Commercial Borrowings (ECBs)
 (raising funds from foreign lenders).
- These alternatives were more expensive due to rising dollar hedging costs.

1) 2025 Chennai Open ATP Challenger: Kyrian Jacquet and Japanese Duo Shine

The 2025 Chennai Open Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) Challenger concluded with France's Kyrian Jacquet clinching the men's singles title and the Japanese duo of Shintaro Mochizuki and Kaito Uesugi securing the doubles crown.

- 2025 was the 5th edition of the Chennai Open, part of the 2025 ATP Challenger Tour, held from February 3-9, 2025, at the SDAT Tennis Stadium in Chennai, Tamil Nadu (TN).
- The Chennai Open offered 100 ranking points and a prize money of USD 22,730 to the singles champion, while the runner-up received USD 3,350 and 50 points.

Singles Final: Jacquet Outlasts Ymer in Straight Sets

- World No. 273 Kyrian Jacquet claimed his maiden ATP Challenger title by defeating Sweden's Elias Ymer (ranked 332).

Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championship 2025

On February 16, 2025, **Indonesia won their first-ever title** at the **4th Edition** of the "Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championship 2025" by defeating two-time defending champions **China with a 3-1 victory** in the final. The tournament was held from February 11 to 16, 2025, at the Conson Gymnasium in Qingdao, China.

- Muhammad Shohibul Fikri served as the captain for the Indonesia team, while the China team was led by captain Chen Xujun.
- Indonesia, for their triumph, earned the coveted gold medal, China took home the silver, while Japan and Thailand were awarded the bronze medals for their victory.

- 4. Men's Doubles: The decisive match saw Indonesia's Muhammad Shohibul Fikri and Daniel Martin comfortably defeat China's Chen Xujun and Huang Di 21-15, 21-9, sealing Indonesia's historic victory and sparking celebrations among the team.
- 5. India's Stance: Team India has been eliminated in the Quarterfinals and placed at 6th in the table.
- 6) 38th Edition of National Games 2025

Services Sports Control Board (SSCB) topped at the 38th edition of National Games which was held in Uttarakhand from January 26, 2025, to February 14, 2025, with 121 medals including 68 gold, 26 silver, and 27 bronze. With this, SSCB continued its dominance in the National Games as it topped the medal tally for 5th time in the last six National Games except in 2023.

- SSCB secured the Raja Bhalindra Singh Trophy, which is awarded to the team that wins the highest number of gold medals at the National Games.
- Maharashtra, secured 2nd position in overall medal tally with 201 medals (54 gold, 71 silver, and 76 bronze).
- It is followed by Haryana ranked at 3rd position with 153 medals (48 gold, 47 silver, and 58 bronze).
- The event, themed 'Green Games', focused on sustainability, featuring eco-friendly welcome kits, e-waste medals, and tree plantations for medalists.

The Chinese city of Harbin is hosting the 9th Asian Winter Games from 7-14 February 2025.

India's Financial Support for Athletes:

- Full Financial Support: For the first time, the government of India is providing full financial support to the Indian contingent under the Assistance to National Sports Federations (ANSF) Scheme.
- Supported Events: Indian athletes participating in Alpine Skiing, Cross-Country Skiing, Figure Skating, Short Track Speed Skating, and Speed Skating (Long Track) will receive this financial support.
- Contingent: India is sending an 88-member contingent to the 9th
 Asian Winter Games, including 59 athletes and 29 officials.

About the 9th Asian Winter Games 2025:

• Host City: Harbin, China, will host the games from 7-14 February

- **2025**. This is Harbin's **second time hosting** the event, having previously done so in **1994**.
- Events and Disciplines: Athletes from 45 countries will compete in 11 disciplines across 6 sports: biathlon, curling, ice hockey, skating, skiing, and ski mountaineering. The games will feature both men's and women's events as well as mixed events in certain sports.
- Mascots: The mascots are Binbin and Nini, both tigers from Northeast China. Binbin represents ice sports, and Nini represents snow sports.
- Slogan: "Dream of Winter, Love among Asia".
- **Emblem**: The emblem is called "**Breakthrough**".

8) India successfully defends its ICC Women's U19 T20 World Cup Title

The Indian women's U19 cricket team demolished South Africa by nine wickets in the final of the 2nd ICC Women's U19 T20 World Cup to retain their title, which was won two years back in South Africa. The final of the tournament was played on 2 February 2025 at the Bayuemas Cricket Oval, Kuala Lumpur Malaysia. This was the major title win for the Niki Prasad-led Indian team, having won the inaugural Asian Cricket Council Women's U19 Asia Cup 2024 Title in Malaysia in December 2024.

South Africa's Performance:

17) Advani Triumphs in Indian Snooker Championship

India's most decorated cueist, Pankaj Advani, secured his 36th national title and 10th men's snooker championship at the Yashwant Club. Displaying remarkable skill and resilience, he defeated Brijesh Damani in the final, overturning an earlier group-stage loss. His victory cements his spot in upcoming international championships, further enhancing his legendary status in cue sports.

Key Highlights

1. Victory and Milestones

- Pankaj Advani clinched his 36th national gold medal and his 10th men's snooker title.
- The tournament is India's sole selection event for the Asian and World Snooker Championships.
- With this win, he continues to dominate Indian cue sports.

- Lost the opening frame but quickly **recovered**, conceding only one more frame in the entire match.
- Sealed the final frame with an impressive 84 break, demonstrating his precision and composure.

18) Rohit Sharma Becomes Second Fastest to 11,000 ODI Runs

Rohit Sharma became the second fastest batsman to reach 11,000 ODI runs, achieving the milestone in 261 innings during India's Champions Trophy 2025 match against Bangladesh in Dubai on February 20, 2025. He is the fourth Indian to reach this mark, joining Sachin Tendulkar, Sourav Ganguly, and Virat Kohli, and the 10th overall in ODI history. Virat Kohli remains the fastest, achieving it in 222 innings. Rohit reached the milestone in the fourth over by hitting Mustafizur Rahman for a boundary over mid-on.

19) Mohammed Shami Joins Elite Club with 200 ODI Wickets

Mohammed Shami became the fastest Indian to claim 200 ODI wickets, achieving the feat during India vs

Bangladesh in the ICC Champions Trophy 2025 at Dubai. He broke Ajit Agarkar's Indian record (133 matches) and equaled Saqlain Mushtaq as the joint second fastest globally, behind Mitchell Starc (102 matches). Shami also became India's highest wicket-taker in ICC ODI events, surpassing Zaheer Khan's 59 wickets, with 60 wickets in just 19 matches.

20) Virat Kohli Breaks Tendulkar's Record for Fastest 14,000 Run

Virat Kohli has created history by becoming the fastest batter to reach 14,000 ODI runs in just 287 innings, surpassing Sachin Tendulkar (350) and Kumar Sangakkara (378). He achieved this milestone during India's Champions Trophy 2025 match against Pakistan in Dubai, scoring a match-winning unbeaten century (51st ODI ton). Known for his remarkable consistency and chase mastery, Kohli has been the fastest to every 1,000-run milestone since 8,000 runs in 2017, cementing his dominance in ODIs.

21) Saurav Ghosal Marks Triumphant Return with Sydney Title

Saurav Ghosal, Indian squash legend and former World No. 10, made a remarkable comeback by winning the Octane Sydney Classic title. After retiring from the PSA Tour in April 2023, he rejoined on January 1, 2025, to continue representing India. The 38-year-old second seed dominated the final, defeating Egypt's Abdelrahman Nasser in straight sets to secure the title.

22) Pankaj Advani Wins 2025 Asian Snooker Championship

Pankaj Advani clinched the 2025 Asian Snooker Championship men's title, defeating Amir Sarkosh (Iran) 4-1 in the final, marking his 14th Asian title across snooker and billiards. The tournament, held in Doha, Qatar (Feb 15-21, 2025), was

organized by the Asian Confederation of Billiards Sports. Advani, a multiple-time Asian and World Champion, has also won two Asian Games gold medals (2006, 2010)

23) Mohun Bagan Clinch Back-to-Back ISL Winners Shield

Mohun Bagan Super Giant secured their second consecutive Indian Super League (ISL) Winners Shield with a dramatic 1-0 victory over Odisha FC at Kolkata's Salt Lake Stadium on February 23, 2025. The match remained tense until the final moments when Dimitrios Petratos struck the winning goal in injury time, making Mohun Bagan the first team in ISL history to defend the Shield successfully. This win also ensures their direct qualification for the AFC Champions League 2.

24) Saudi Arabia to Host Inaugural Olympic Esports Games 2027

- The International **Olympic** Committee (IOC) made groundbreaking decision in July 2023 by introducing the Olympic **Esports** Games, marking significant step toward integrating esports with traditional sports. In a historic development, Saudi Arabia has been selected as the host nation for the first-ever **Olympic Esports Games in 2027.**

1) India-Japan Joint Military Exercise 'Dharma Guardian 2025' to be Held at Mount Fuji

The sixth edition of Exercise Dharma Guardian is set to take place from February 25 to March 9, 2025, at Mount Fuji, Japan. This annual Indo-Japanese military exercise is a key initiative aimed at bolstering strategic and defence cooperation between the Indian Army and the Japan Ground Self-Defense Force (JGSDF).

Background and Significance

Exercise Dharma Guardian is an annual **joint military exercise** between India and Japan. It plays a crucial role in strengthening defence ties between the two nations and enhancing interoperability between their armed forces. The exercise is held alternatively in **India and Japan**, with the previous edition (2024) conducted in **India**.

The upcoming **2025 edition** of the exercise comes after the successful visit of India's Chief of the Army Staff to Japan in October 2024. The visit paved the way for deeper military collaboration, showcasing both countries' commitment to regional security and stability in the Indo-Pacific **region**. Given the evolving security challenges in the region, joint military training programs like **Dharma Guardian** essential to improve combat address common preparedness and threats.

2) Saab and HAL Sign MoU for Local Production of LWS-310 Electronic Warfare System

On February 13, 2025, Swedish defence company Saab signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Hindustan Limited Aeronautics (HAL) collaborate on the Electronic Warfare Laser Warning System-310 (LWS-310). This agreement strengthens India's defence capabilities enabling by domestic production of the system, in line with the 'Make in India' initiative and the goal of achieving self-reliance in critical defence technology.

Objective of the Saab-HAL MoU

The primary purpose of the MoU is to establish a **structured partnership** for the **production and maintenance** of the **LWS-310 system** in India. Key aspects include:

1. Technology Transfer:

- Saab will transfer critical maintenance technology to HAL through a Maintenance Transfer of Technology (ToT) agreement.
- This ensures that HAL can support and sustain the LWS-310 system independently in India.

2. Domestic Manufacturing:

- HAL will manufacture the LWS-310 system, reducing dependence on foreign suppliers.
- This supports India's goal of building a self-sufficient defence sector.

3. Enhanced Combat Capabilities:

o The **LWS-310** is designed to detect **laser-based**

- **threats** quickly and accurately.
- It provides early warnings against laser-guided weapons, improving the survivability of combat vehicles and aircraft.

4. Long-Term Operational Support:

- By setting up local production and maintenance facilities, the MoU ensures sustained support for the LWS-310 in India.
- This also enables faster servicing and upgrades without relying on foreign manufacturers.

3) Aeronautical Development Agreement for MDN100 Steel

- The MoU was signed at the Aero India 2025 airshow held from 10-14 February 2025 in Bengaluru.

Note: ADA is the nodal organization for combat aircraft development in India.

These tests were conducted against high-speed aerial targets flying at low altitudes, reinforcing India's defence capabilities. The showcased the missile system's precision, reliability, and effectiveness in neutralizing airborne threats, particularly drones and loitering munitions.

Successful Flight Tests:

- DRDO conducted three consecutive flight trials of the Very Short-Range Air Defence System (VSHORADS) on February 1, 2025, at the Chandipur test range in Odisha.
- The tests targeted high-speed, lowaltitude threats simulating drones.

Impressive Interception Capability:

 In all trials, the system successfully intercepted and destroyed the targets, which mimicked low-flying drones with reduced thermal signatures.

Final Deployment Configuration:

- The missile system was tested in its final deployment configuration.
- Two field operators managed weapon readiness, target acquisition, and missile launch.

7) India's Defence Ministry Pilot Study on LAWS

The innovative LAAM system, a collaboration between IIT Hyderabad, **DRDO's Defence** Research & Development Laboratory (DRDL), and various industry partners, is set to revolutionize the way large components, particularly for the aerospace and defense sectors, are fabricated. By enabling the large-scale production of metal parts through additive manufacturing, this achievement paves the way for India's future growth in advanced manufacturing technology.

12) HAL's Upgraded Hindustan Jet Trainer 36 Renamed 'Yashas'

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) has officially renamed its Hindustan Jet Trainer (HJT-36) as 'Yashas' after significant modifications aimed at improving its flight characteristics. The renaming event took place at Aero India 2025, marking a new phase in the aircraft's development for advanced pilot training and operational roles.

Key Upgrades and Modifications

The 'Yashas' has undergone extensive enhancements to address **departure characteristics and spin resistance**, making it more stable and safer for pilot training. The modifications ensure:

- Enhanced departure recovery and spin resistance, allowing for a wider flight envelope.
- State-of-the-art avionics and ultra-modern cockpit, improving situational awareness and training effectiveness.
- Optimized flight control systems, making the aircraft more maneuverable and reliable.

The unveiling ceremony was led by Secretary (Defence Production) Sanjeev Kumar, alongside HAL Chairman & Managing Director Dr. D K Sunil and other senior officials.

13) Indian Coast Guard Holds 'Sagar Kavach' Drill for Coastal Security

Indian Coast Guard (ICG) The conducted **'Sagar** successfully the Kavach' security exercise along the 158 km West Bengal coastline on February 21-22, 2025. This two-day operation aimed to test and enhance the coastal security mechanism by involving multiple agencies in tackling simulated threats. The exercise focused on refining Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and strengthening inter-agency coordination to counter potential threats along India's eastern maritime border.

14) India, Bangladesh Set Up New Border Hotline

The BSF-BGB director general-level talks (Feb 18-20, 2025) led to key agreements on border security and communication. A new hotline will be set up between BSF's Eastern Command (Kolkata) and BGB (Dhaka) to enhance coordination. Both nations identified 99 new border patches (70-72 km) for fencing, while 92 patches (95.8 km) are already under construction. With 864.48 km of the border still unfenced, efforts will

continue to address security gaps. **BGB** committed to stricter action against border crimes, including enhanced night patrolling.

15) Military Exercise 'Jal-Thal-Raksha 2025' Held at Bet Dwarka

The Indian Army, in collaboration with the Indian Coast Guard and Marine **Police**, conducted the large-scale military exercise 'Jal-Thal-Raksha 2025' at Bet Dwarka, Gujarat. The drill focused on island security, combating illegal encroachments, and enhancing coordination between security forces. SCIENCE AND TECH NEWS

1) Euclid Captures a Perfect Einstein Ring

The European Space Agency's (ESA) Euclid telescope, launched on July 1, 2023, embarked on a six-year mission to explore the dark Universe. During an initial testing phase in September 2023, Euclid's scientists unexpectedly discovered a rare and nearly perfect Einstein Ring within the galaxy NGC 6505, located 590 million light-years away. This luminous ring was formed by the gravitational lensing of light from a much more distant, yet unnamed, galaxy 4.42 billion light-years away. discovery highlights Euclid's immense capabilities in uncovering cosmic secrets and advancing our understanding of gravity, dark matter, and dark energy.

Overview of the Euclid Mission

- Launched: July 1, 2023, by the European Space Agency (ESA).
- Mission Duration: Six years (2023–2029).
- Primary Goal: To explore the dark Universe, focusing on dark matter, dark energy, and cosmic evolution.
- Coverage: Mapping one-third of the sky, capturing billions of galaxies up to 10 billion lightyears away.

- Survey Start Date: February 14, 2024 (official full-scale sky survey).
- Scientific Importance:
 - Understanding the nature of dark matter and dark energy.
 - Investigating gravitational lensing effects to study cosmic structures.
 - Contributing to models of Universe expansion and galaxy evolution.

2) China to Build First Deepwater 'Space Station' in South China Sea

After years of deliberation and technical evaluations, China has officially approved the construction of a deep-sea research facility in the strategically significant South China Sea. The facility, referred to as a "deep-sea space station," will be anchored 2,000 meters (6,560 feet) below the ocean surface. It aims to advance marine exploration and strengthen China's geopolitical presence in the resource-rich region. Expected to be operational by 2030, the station will accommodate six scientists for month-long missions, enabling real-time experiments in extreme underwater conditions.

Overview of the Project

- China has officially approved the construction of a deep-sea research facility in the South China Sea after years of deliberation and technical evaluations.
- The facility, referred to as a "deepsea space station," will be located 2,000 meters (6,560 feet) below the ocean surface.
- It will be one of the deepest and most technologically advanced

- **underwater research stations** ever built.
- The project is expected to be **fully operational by 2030**.
- The station will accommodate six scientists for missions lasting up to one month, allowing for realtime experiments in extreme underwater conditions.

3) Meta's 50,000 km Cable to Boost India-US Digital Connectivity

Meta has launched Project Waterworth, a 50,000-kilometer undersea cable initiative aimed at improving digital connectivity between India, the United States, South America, and Africa. The project is expected to enhance internet speed, reliability, and accessibility while future-proofing global digital infrastructure to support AI, cloud computing, and digital services.

What is Meta's Project Waterworth?

- Project Waterworth is an ambitious undersea cable project by Meta aimed at enhancing global digital connectivity.
- The project will span **50,000 kilometers**, making it one of the **largest undersea cable networks** globally.
- It will connect India, the US, Brazil, South Africa, and multiple other regions, improving internet access across these continents.
- The cable will support high-speed internet services for various applications, including:
 - o Social media interactions.
 - o Cloud computing.
 - Artificial Intelligence (AI) applications.

 Financial services, healthcare, education, and e-commerce.

4) TrailGuard AI: Revolutionizing Anti-Poaching Efforts in Wildlife Conservation

The integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in wildlife conservation has significantly enhanced anti-poaching strategies, leading to a substantial reduction in poaching incidents. One of the most impactful innovations in this field is TrailGuard AI, an advanced surveillance system designed to detect and prevent illegal activities in protected areas.

A notable example of its successful implementation is the **Similipal Tiger Reserve in Odisha**, where officials have observed remarkable improvements in wildlife protection.

5) India's Matsya-6000 Successfully Completes Wet Testing for Deep-Sea Exploration

On February 17, 2025, India's 4th-generation deep-ocean submersible 'Matsya-6000' successfully completed its wet testing at L&T Shipbuilding facility in Kattupalli Port, Chennai (Tamil Nadu, TN).

- It was developed and tested by the National Institute of Ocean Technology (NIOT), Chennai under the Samudrayaan Project, and was designed for deep-sea exploration and scientific research.
- i. Before undergoing wet testing, Matsya-6000 completed dry tests at a 500 m operational range to assess the integration and performance of the submersible, ensuring its readiness for more advanced trials.
- ii. From January 27 to February 12, 2025, Matsya-6000 underwent wet testing at Kattupalli Port, involving 8 dives: 5 unmanned and 3 manned. iii. The tests focused on key performance

parameters, such as power control, buoyancy, stability, maneuverability, safety, and the functionality of its scientific instruments.

6) Sunita Williams Sets New Spacewalk Record

Indian-origin Sunita astronaut Williams has made history by setting a new record for the longest spacewalking time by a woman. With a total of 62 hours and 6 spacewalking minutes of across nine spacewalks, she surpassed the previous record held by Peggy Whitson, who logged 60 hours and 21 minutes. This new achievement occurred during her most recent extravehicular activity (EVA) alongside fellow astronaut Butch the **International** Wilmore on Station (ISS).

Key Highlights of Williams's Record- Breaking Achievement

- Spacewalk Duration: The recordbreaking spacewalk lasted 5 hours and 26 minutes, starting at 7:43 am ET and concluding at 1:09 pm ET.
- Purpose of the Spacewalk: During this EVA, Williams and Wilmore removed degraded radio communications hardware and collected samples to check for microorganisms on the exterior of the ISS.
- Spacewalking History: With this accomplishment, Williams now ranks fourth on NASA's all-time spacewalking list.

Extended Stay on the ISS

 Launch and Mission: Williams and Wilmore launched aboard Boeing's Starliner

- spacecraft in June 2024 for an eight-day mission. However, due to technical issues with the spacecraft, including helium leaks and thruster malfunctions, the Starliner was deemed unsafe for their return.
- **Return Plans**: They are currently awaiting their return to Earth, which is now scheduled for **late March 2025** aboard a **SpaceX spacecraft**.

Williams's Notable Achievements

- Triathlon in Space: In 2012, Williams became the first person to complete a triathlon in space, using the ISS's exercise equipment to swim, bike, and run in microgravity.
- **Previous Spacewalks**: This recent spacewalk was her **ninth**, while Wilmore completed his **fifth** EVA.

In January 2025, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO)'s astronaut and the Force fighter pilot of Indian Air (IAF), Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla, has been named the pilot for Axiom Mission 4(Ax-4), a private spaceflight for International Space Station (ISS). • With this announcement, he will become the 1st Indian astronaut to go to the ISS on a private mission and also the 1st Indian to go to space in the last 40 years.

Brief Notes:

Captain Shubhanshu Shukla, an astronaut of ISRO and a fighter pilot with the Indian Air Force (IAF), has been named the pilot for the Axiom Mission 4 (Ax-4) private

- spaceflight to the International Space Station (ISS).
- **Significance:** He will become the first Indian astronaut to participate in a private mission to the ISS and the first Indian to go to space in 40 years.

10) ISRO's NVS-02 Satellite Faces Orbit-Raising Challenge

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is addressing a significant technical issue with its NVS-02 navigation satellite, launched on January 2025, aboard the GSLV-F15 rocket. Post-launch, the satellite's solar panels deployed successfully, and communication with ground control was established. However, a malfunctioning valve has prevented the Liquid Apogee Motor (LAM) from firing, hindering the satellite's orbit-raising maneuvers. Consequently, NVS-02 remains in an elliptical **Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO)** instead of reaching its designated geostationary orbit.

Overview:

- **Launch Date:** January 29, 2025, aboard the GSLV-F15 rocket.
- Post-launch: Successful solar panel deployment and communication with ground control.
- **Issue:** A malfunctioning valve prevented the Liquid Apogee Motor (LAM) from firing, hindering the satellite's orbit-raising maneuvers.

Cause of the Problem:

- The failure of valves to open prevented the oxidizer from reaching the thrusters required for orbit-raising operations.
- The satellite is stuck in an elliptical Geosynchronous
 Transfer Orbit (GTO) instead of achieving the desired geostationary orbit.

11) India's First AI University to Open in Maharashtra

Maharashtra is set to establish India's first **Artificial** Intelligence (AI) university, significant step advancing AI education, research, and **innovation**. A dedicated task force has been formed to plan and implement the project, bringing together experts from academia, industry, and the **government**.

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully conducted the ignition trial of the CE20 cryogenic engine, which powers the upper stage of the Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM3). The engine was indigenously developed by the

Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre (LPSC) of ISRO.

This **high-altitude test** simulated engine ignition in a vacuum condition, a crucial step for ISRO's future missions, including **Gaganyaan**.

In February 2025, Union Minister of State (MoS) (Independent Charge, IC) Dr. Jitendra Singh, Ministry of Science and Technology (MoS&T) and the Ministry of Earth Science (MoES), launched India's first Indigenous Automated Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Plant (BMWTP) named "Srjanam" at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi (AIIMS New Delhi) in Delhi.

 It was developed by Thiruvananthapuram (Kerala) based Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR) -National Institute for Interdisciplinary Science and Technology (NIIST).

- It marks a major step forward in the sustainable handling of biomedical waste.
- It replaces costly and energyintensive incinerators, besides imparting a pleasant fragrance to these foul-smelling toxic waste.

14) ISRO & IIT-M Develop Indigenous RISC-V Controller Chip 'IRIS' for Space Applications

In February 2025, **Thiruvananthapuram** (Kerala)-based Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Inertial Systems Unit (IISU) in partnership with Chennai (Tamil Nadu, TN)-based Indian Institute Technology of Madras (IIT-M). indigenously designed & developed a semiconductor chip named "Indigenous (Reduced Instruction Set Computer) RISC-V Controller for Space Applications (IRIS)". IRIS has been built on the SHAKTI processor baseline.

 It is the 3rd SHAKTI-based microprocessor chip, successfully fabricated in India after RIMO (2018) and MOUSHIK (2020).

This marks a significant milestone toward self-reliance in space and semiconductor technology, reaffirming India's efforts under the 'Make in India' initiative and 'Atmanirbhar' initiatives

About SHAKTI Project:

i. The microprocessor project is supported by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) under its 'Digital India RISC-V Microprocessor (DIR-V)' program. It aims to promote the indigenized development microprocessor-based products. ii. The project is led by **Dr. Veezhinathan** Kamakoti, Professor at Prathap Subrahmanyam Centre for **Digital** and Intelligence Secure Hardware

Architecture (PSCDISHA) in the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at IIT-M.

15) SpinLaunch's Innovative Satellite Launch Technology

SpinLaunch, a California-based company, has developed an innovative method to launch satellites into low Earth orbit (LEO) without using traditional rocket fuel.

 Technology: The system employs a ground-based, electric-powered kinetic launch mechanism, essentially a massive rotating arm, to catapult satellites into space.

• Process:

- The satellite is placed inside a vacuum-sealed centrifuge and rapidly spun to high speeds.
- It is then released through a launch tube, propelling it toward space.
- Once the satellite reaches a certain altitude, it activates its own propulsion system to achieve the desired orbit.
- Support: SpinLaunch is supported by NASA, Airbus, and the U.S. Department of Defense.
- Future Plans: The company plans to launch satellite constellations by 2026 for sustainable spaceflight.

18) First Astronaut with Disability Cleared for ISS Mission

In a groundbreaking development, the European Space Agency (ESA) has medically cleared British astronaut John McFall, a former Paralympian with a prosthetic leg, for long-duration missions to the International Space Station (ISS). This historic decision marks a significant milestone in making space exploration more inclusive.

19) ISRO Develops World's Largest Vertical Propellant Mixer

The Indian Space Research Organisation achieved a significant (ISRO) has milestone by developing a 10-tonne vertical planetary mixer, the largest of its solid globally, for propellant production. This indigenous mixer. created in collaboration with the Central Manufacturing **Technology Institute** (CMTI) in Bengaluru, is set to enhance the efficiency and safety of solid rocket manufacturing, marking motor substantial advancement in India's space capabilities.

20) NASA and SpaceX to Launch Athena to Moon

Athena, a robotic moon lander by Intuitive Machines, is set for launch on February 26, 2025, aboard a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket from NASA's Kennedy Space Center. This marks the company's second lunar mission, following its historic first private moon landing in 2024. Part of NASA's CLPS program, Athena will analyze lunar soil composition,

search for subsurface water, and test Nokia's 4G communication system. Targeting Mons Mouton in the Moon's south polar region, the mission aims to support future lunar exploration and habitation.

21) Moon's South Pole: First Detailed Geological Map Unveiled

Indian scientists have achieved a historic breakthrough by creating the first-ever detailed geological map of the Moon's south pole, using data from the Chandrayaan-3 mission. This new map provides crucial insights into the lunar surface, offering valuable information about the region's topography, crater formations, and geological history. The research, a collaborative effort between the **Physical** Research Laboratory (Ahmedabad), **Paniab** University (Chandigarh), and ISRO's Laboratory for Electro-Optics Systems, marks a significant step in understanding the Moon's evolution.

22) Pixxel's Firefly: Revolutionizing India's Space Tech

Bengaluru-based startup Pixxel has marked a historic milestone by launching India's first private **hyperspectral** satellite constellation under its Firefly project. The launch, which took place aboard SpaceX's **Transporter-12** rideshare mission from Vandenberg Space Force Base, California, signifies a major shift in the Indian space sector, bringing players into private a domain traditionally dominated by government agencies.

23) NASA's Lunar Trailblazer: Mapping the Moon's Water

NASA's Lunar Trailblazer, a small satellite launched aboard a SpaceX Falcon 9 on February 26, aims to map lunar water and analyze its distribution, form,

and variability in the Moon's shadowed craters, especially at the South Pole. Equipped with HVM3 (NASA JPL) and LTM (University of Oxford) instruments, the mission will provide high-resolution water maps, aiding future lunar exploration and resource utilization. Part of NASA's SIMPLEx program, this low-cost, high-risk mission could help astronauts extract water, oxygen, and fuel, advancing sustainable space travel.

1) India's Renewable Energy Growth and Future Projections (2024-2027)

India's share of renewable energy (RE) is projected to rise from 21% in 2024 to 27% by 2027. According to the International Energy Agency (IEA), the growth is mainly driven by solar power, which is expected to increase by more than 28% between 2025 and 2027.

 This transition aims to balance economic growth, energy security, and environmental sustainability over the next decade.

On February 11, 2025, Berlin (Germany)-based International Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), **Transparency International** (**TI**) released its 2024 Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI 2024), which evaluated the perceived levels of public sector corruption across 180 countries.

- According to the 2024 CPI Report,
 India ranks 96th out of 180 countries with a score of 38, marking a decline from its 2023 position, where India ranked 93rd with a score of 39. India's score and rank were shared by Gambia and Maldives.
- Denmark tops the 2024 CPI, for the 7th consecutive time with a score of 90, followed by Finland (88) and Singapore (84).
- i. The 2024 CPI highlights that about 85% of the world (about 6.8 billion people) live in countries with high corruption. ii. South Sudan ranked 180th (score 8), Somalia at 179th (score 9), Venezuela at 178th (score 10), and Syria at 177th (score 12) are the most corrupt nations, ranking at the bottom.
- 3) Karnataka Tops Devolution Index 2024 for Empowering Panchayats; Report Released by MoS S.P. Singh Baghel

On **February 13, 2025**, Union Minister of State (MoS), **S.P. Singh Baghel**, Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR), Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying (MoFAH&D) released the **Devolution Index Report 2024** titled "Status of Devolution to Panchayats in States – An Indicative Evidence-Based Ranking 2024"

at the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi (Delhi).

This growth will be mainly driven by robust growth in city

gas distribution, industrial demand, and power generation.

- While, Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) imports are projected to more than double between 2023 and 2030, to 65 bcm annually, driven by steady demand growth and a much slower increase in domestic production.
- The key findings of the report were released during the India Energy Week (IEW) celebration held in New Delhi, Delhi.

13) Reliance Beats Apple, Ranks 2nd in FutureBrand 2024

- Reliance Industries Limited has achieved a historic milestone by securing the second position in the FutureBrand Index 2024. This is the first time an Indian company has ranked in the top three of this prestigious global ranking, surpassing major multinational corporations like Apple, Nike, Disney, Netflix, Microsoft, Intel, and Toyota. Samsung secured the top position in the ranking.
- Unlike traditional financial rankings, the FutureBrand Index evaluates companies based on brand perception, consumer trust, and influence rather than financial performance. This recognition highlights Reliance's growing global impact and strong brand positioning.

14) India's Smartphone Exports Reach ₹1.5 Trillion, Boosted by PLI Scheme

India's smartphone exports have reached an all-time high of ₹1.55 trillion in the period from April 2024 to January 2025.

- This marks a 56% increase compared to ₹991.2 billion in the same period last year.
- The surge in exports is primarily attributed to the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, which has strengthened India's smartphone manufacturing ecosystem.
- Global companies like Apple and Samsung are leading the export growth, with Apple contributing nearly 70% of total smartphone exports from India.
- The Indian government's push for local production and self-reliance has played a key role in positioning India as a major smartphone manufacturing and export hub.

15) Urban Unemployment Rate Steady at 6.4% in Q3 FY25

The urban unemployment rate in India stood unchanged at 6.4% in the October-December quarter of FY25, according to the latest Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) on February 18, 2025. This follows a slight decline from 6.6% in Q1 FY25 to 6.4% in Q2 FY25, indicating a stable employment scenario in urban areas.

- Urban unemployment rate remained unchanged at 6.4% in the October-December quarter of FY25, as per the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) released by MoSPI on February 18, 2025.
- The rate had previously declined from 6.6% in Q1 FY25 to 6.4% in Q2 FY25, indicating employment stability in urban areas.
